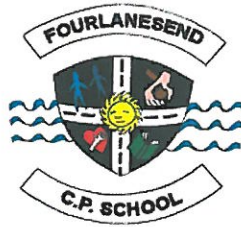

Observations and Discussions

Online safety presentation attended by 30 parents; given by pupils and staff. Pupils' feedback from online safety day led to an online safety presentation given to parents and carers on the safe use of the Internet. It was apparent that children have a good understanding of staying safe online, however concerns had been raised about parents' privacy settings with their own use of social media. There was a focus on Youtube, social media, access to parents' phones and privacy settings.

Pupils were fully aware and have an excellent understanding of the dangers of being online and delivered the presentation through role play and talks, it is clear that there is culture of vigilance.

All year groups participated, with high levels of understanding throughout the school.

Staff ended the presentation with online safety advice for parents and carers. Links and guidance have been placed on the school website for parents, this was demonstrated and include details of keeping children safe when using Youtube and advises on privacy setting for parents.

Parental engagement was solid with very good feedback given to governors and staff at the end of the school day, especially in regard to pupil's knowledge and understanding of online safety matters and teachers knowledge of potential issues with incorrect use of the Internet.

Pupils have the ability to recognise right from wrong which links with school values, and are able to apply this through their daily lives.

Information leaflets were available at the end for parents to support online safety.
