




Nursery News 15

This week ...

We are learning about baby animals. We have been matching pictures of baby animals with pictures of their parents and learning the different names for the babies. We have been reading the story "Monkey Puzzle" by Julia Donaldson and talking about how some baby animals look very different to their mothers and some are similar. We have been listening to animal sounds and trying to identify them. Our cress seeds have grown and we are making and eating cress sandwiches.
