




Nursery News 17

Over the last two weeks ...

We continued our "On the Move" topic by learning about farm animals, based around the story "What the Ladybird Heard." We have also learned about snails and read the story "Snail Trail" by Ruth Brown. We investigated the different body parts of minibeasts and sorted them into those that have legs and those that don't. We made slimy trails with jelly and had a look at real snails through magnifying glasses.

Sports Day – Tuesday 2nd July

The nursery children will be taking part in some races on the school field from 11am. Please send them to school in suitable clothes and shoes for this, they do not need to wear uniform on that day: T-shirts and shorts/leggings (with a hoody/sweatshirt if the weather isn't warm).
