




Nursery News 14

This week and last week in Nursery...

We have been reading the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. During the holidays some small caterpillars arrived and we have been watching them change into chrysalides. We have transferred them from their pot into a net and are waiting for the transformation into Painted Lady butterflies in a few days' time. As well as talking about the life cycle of the butterfly we have also been learning about the life cycle of a frog. Our Maths activities have included saying the days of the week in order and counting fruit. The children have enjoyed lots of Art activities including printing butterflies. We have also made healthy eating caterpillars with cucumber, pepper and tomatoes.

Next week...

We will be reading the story "Oliver's Vegetables" and learning about where fruit and vegetables come from. We will be making our own chips from potatoes, like Oliver does in the story, and planting some cress seeds.
