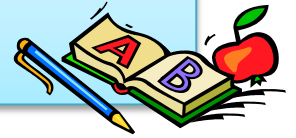




# Nursery News 16

## This week ...

We have started our new topic called "On the Move". We are beginning by learning about minibeasts which move in the air: ladybirds, dragonflies, wasps etc. We have been reading the story of "The Bad-Tempered Ladybird" by Eric Carle, counting spots and finding out facts about ladybirds. Mrs Rutter, one of our teaching assistants, is going to tell the children about keeping bees and will bring some honey for them to taste.

## Move Up Morning
