



## Sport Premium Overview 2015-16

**“We believe that physical education, experienced in a safe and supportive environment, is a unique and vital contributor to a pupil's physical development and well-being. Through the selection of suitably differentiated tasks, it is intended that pupils, irrespective of their starting ability, will enjoy success and be motivated to further develop their individual potential.”**

At Throckley Primary School we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better. We have welcomed the Government's announcement to extend the Sport Premium to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The Government is spending over £450 million on this funding over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016.

We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

### Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January 2013. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

### What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

*‘Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this’ (DfE June 2013).*

At Throckley Primary School we have split up the funding by the three key areas for consideration; **Physical Education/Curricular PE, Healthy Active Lifestyles** and **Competitive Sport**. We have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant on the following:
