Bugle School has been offered a fantastic opportunity to visit Barton Farm and the Caerhays Estate to experience sheep farming. The children will learn all about the lambing season and if this year's lambs have been born, they may have a practical experience of handling them. We may also have some time to explore some of the other varied areas of the estate's grounds.

We will be leaving in the school minibus soon after registration and your child should arrive at school wearing clothes suitable for the outdoors. A coat must be taken on the trip as we will be exploring the farm even if it is raining. Wellington boots to change into once we are there are highly recommended. Please make sure that your child will be warm enough as the animal barns are not heated. A hat and gloves are strongly advised. You may wish to provide your child with some healthy tuck for when we arrive at the estate.

A packed lunch will be provided by the school canteen for this trip but your child can bring his/her own packed lunch if you would prefer. Please do not include fizzy drinks.

Your child's trip will be on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> November/Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> November. We will be returning to school before the end of the school day.

The class will be divided into two groups for this trip, each group will have their day's experience on one or other of the dates above. For the group staying at school it will be a normal school day.
