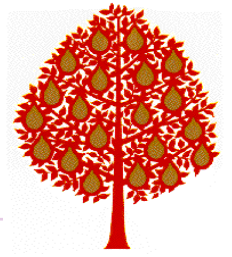

Half Term Holiday

The government confirmed this week that schools will close as usual over February half-term and are not expected to remain open to vulnerable children and the children of critical workers during that time. The last day of this half term is Friday 12th February 2021. Please also note that Monday 22nd February is a Non-pupils INSET staff training day and Perryfields Infant School will be closed to all pupils on this day. The school will re-open for children of critical workers and vulnerable pupils only on Tuesday 23rd February 2021 and remote learning will be provided from Tuesday 23rd February that week for everyone else.

Critical workers

Please can I remind critical worker parents that if your child(ren) can remain at home rather than attend school, on some or all days, then they should. Please only use the offer of provision when it is crucial for you to undertake your critical role. Please remember to come into school at the correct time on your allocated days and use the correct year group entrance. No-one should be accessing the front school reception entrance to help reduce the chances of Covid-19 transmission. Many thanks.
