A writing project, aimed in the first instance at UKS2 boys West Cornwall Teaching School commissioned a research project to create a fun intervention programme for boys to help raise standards in Y6 boys writing. Using relevant research from Carol Dweck, John Hattie, Gary Wilson, Guy Claxton and Daniel Pink amongst others, a programme of activities was devised which matched the relevant Learning Objectives for the year. The project was implemented in 4 schools and all ran a successful programme which showed a significant improvement in results.

Raising the achievement of disadvantaged children – Andy Brumby & Robin Cowen, The Learning Academy Trust

'Whenever we've seen the kids in the most disadvantaged context truly excel, always it's been in classrooms and in whole schools where there is a clear vision of where the kids have the potential to be.' - Wendy Kopp

Over the past three years The Learning Academy Trust (TLAT) has enjoyed considerable success when it comes to improving outcomes for disadvantaged pupils. Built on a culture of high expectations and no excuses, TLAT's innovative work in this area of school improvement has attracted regional and national interest. In this session TLAT's CEO Robin Cowen and Director of Achievement Andy Brumby will describe how the Trust and its partners have gone about making this happen. Important keys to success have included building up a detailed picture of the barriers to learning that affect pupils across our schools, avoiding unhelpful stereo-types and assumptions, taking action to support more able disadvantaged pupils and interrogating Pupil Premium cohort data in alternative ways. Above all, we regard raising the achievement of disadvantaged pupils as being at the very core of our existential purpose. To that end, as it clearly states in our raising achievement policy, 'every person employed by TLAT has a part to play in helping disadvantaged children to achieve educational excellence, and each of us acknowledges that we are accountable for the impact of our efforts to improve outcomes and diminish gaps in achievement'. www.tlat.org.uk/web/pupil_premium/265028
