Dear Parents,

Following the retirement of our **caretaker**, Vic, at the end of last term, I am delighted to inform you that we have appointed two new members of staff to undertake this role on a job-share basis. We welcome **Peter Dean** and **Uldis Kuģis** to the team, both of whom will be starting work with us in the next couple of weeks.

By now the children will have come home with their **home learning activities and projects**. Some of the tasks should be completed on a weekly basis to support their English and Maths learning, but there are also tasks that let them explore their learning in a way that they would prefer through a longer term project. To support the completion of their home learning and to give parents the opportunity to be part of that learning, we will be making resources and a space available for you as parents/carers to work with your children on the projects in school. You will need to stay with your child during these sessions. These will be Monday 6th November (Y5/6), Monday 13th November (Y1/2) and Monday 20th November (Y3/4) between 3:15 and 4:15pm in each classroom. **Homework club** will also continue on a Thursday after school, from 3:10-4 pm. If you have any further questions about the homework or how the projects could be presented, please contact your child's class teacher in the first instance.

As we did last year, we will be holding a 'Home Learning' exhibition on Thursday 30th November to celebrate this learning. This will be held in the school hall from 2:30pm- 5:00pm.




