The school has three principal aims in regard to the Sports Premium Funding:

- To increase opportunities for children to engage in sporting activities.
- To increase the amount of intra and inter school competitions.
- To develop the staff's capacity to deliver high quality sports provision.

A large part of the funding has therefore been allocated to fund involvement with the Camborne Science and International Academy Sports Alliance. This alliance is organised by a secondary school that the school feeds into. Being part of the alliance allows the school to:



- Take part in a wide variety of inter-school competitions organised by the alliance.
- Receive support from specialist PE teachers to plan high quality, skills based, sport specific units of work.
- Develop sports leaders in the school.
- Benefit from top up swimming lessons for those not able to swim after normal curriculum provision.

To make sure our involvement with the alliance has maximum benefit a further pool of money has been put aside to develop a coordinator role for a member of staff (Su Kent) in the school who will develop the profile of sport in the school and provide further opportunities for children's involvement.

Finally several pools of money have been used to offer a wider range of clubs without having to charge families for the cost of external providers and therefore increase uptake from disadvantaged families.
