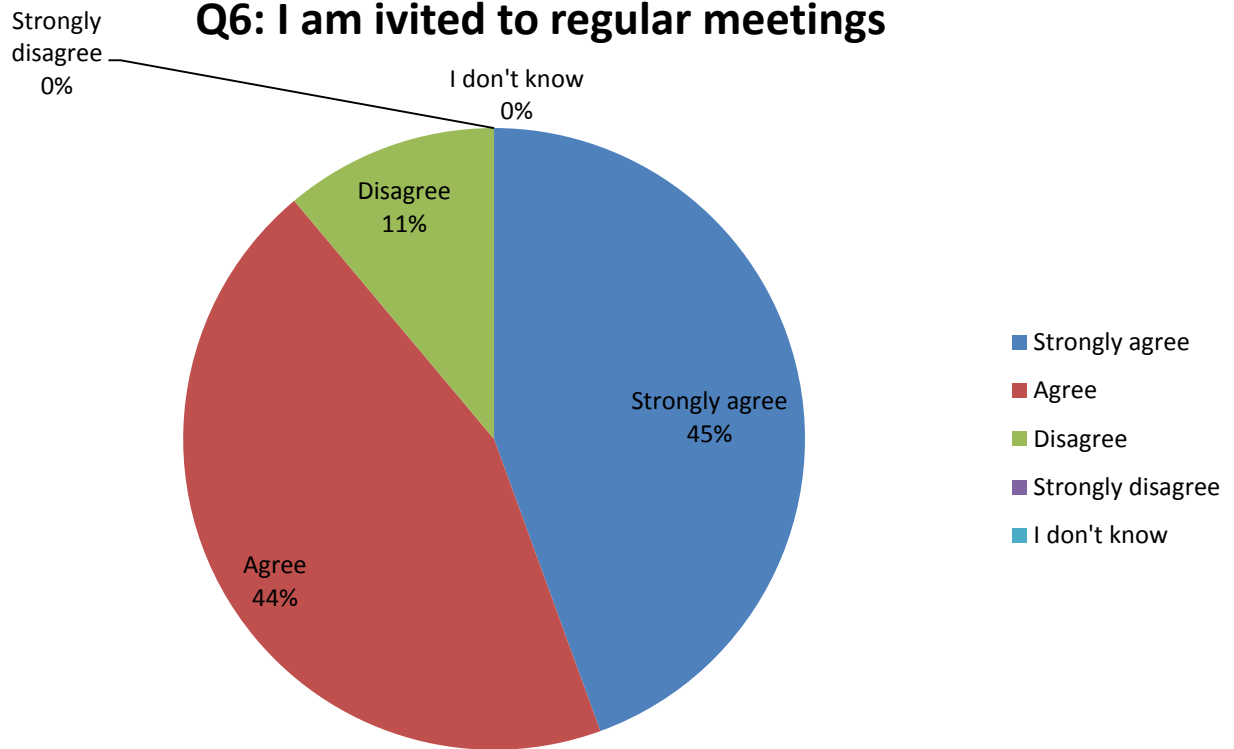
Q4: I know my child's SEN



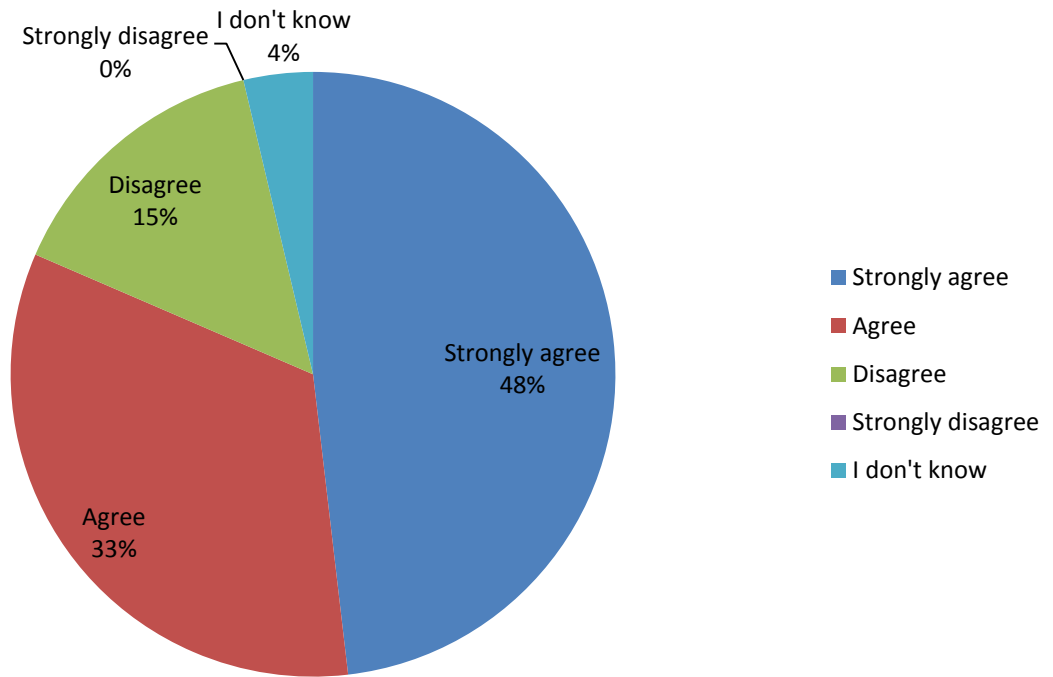

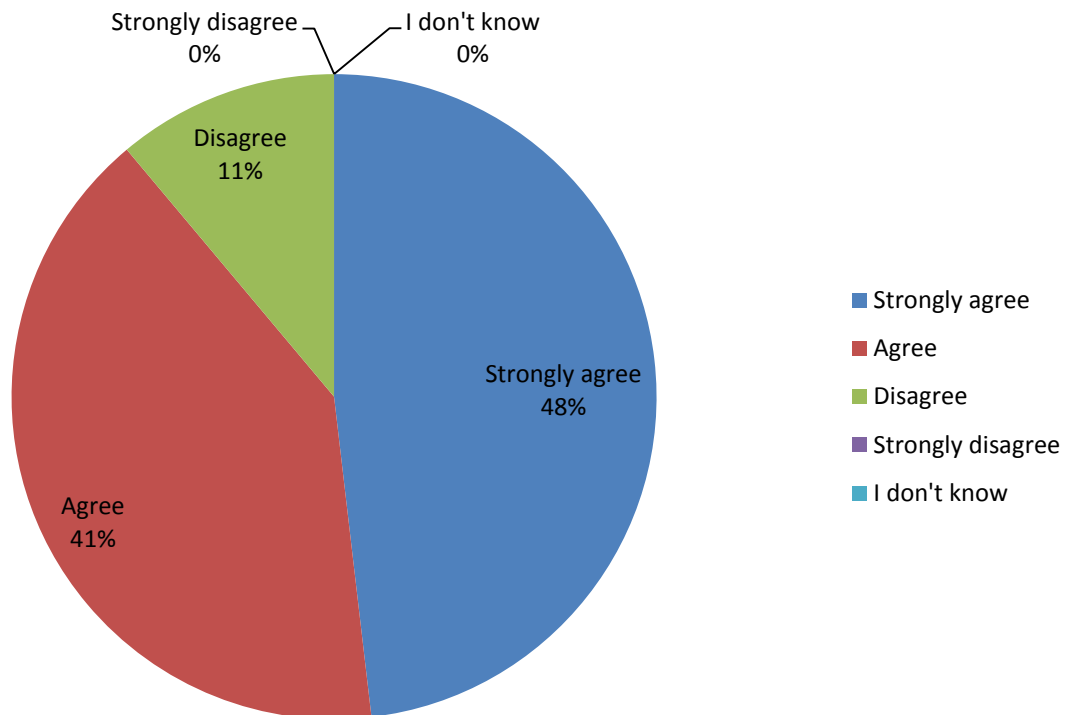

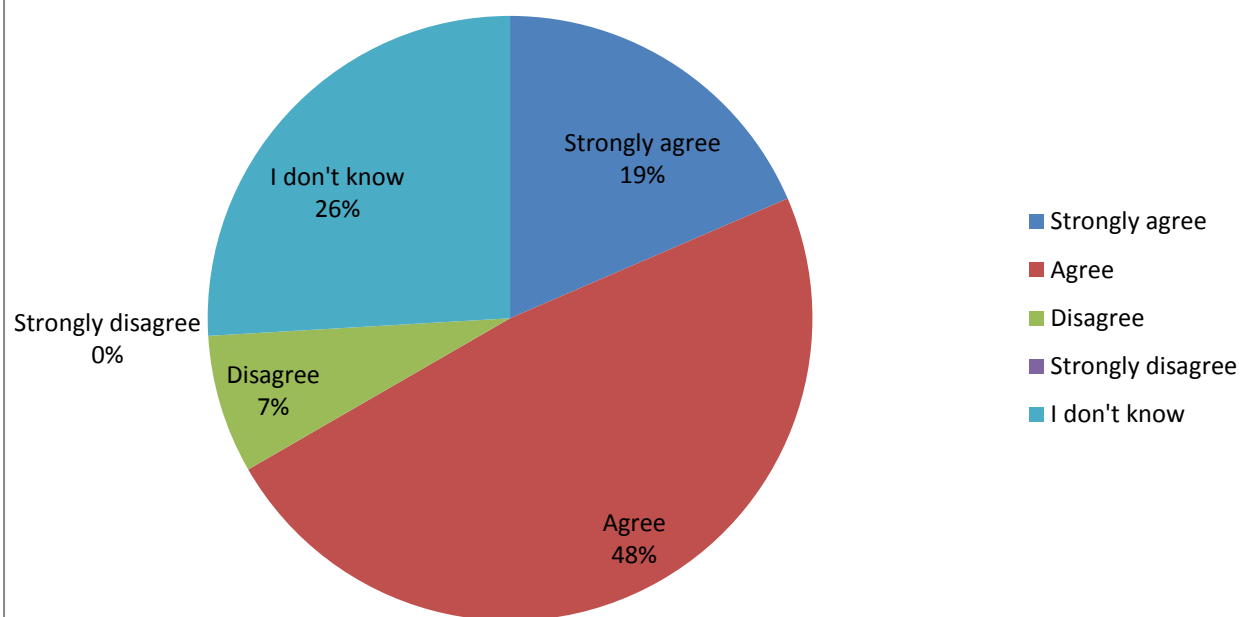
