“A4.7 Disqualification of LGC members

- A4.7.1 No person shall be qualified to serve on the LGC unless they are aged 18 or over at the date of his or her election or appointment. No current pupil of the academy shall be entitled to serve on the LGC.
- A4.7.2 A person serving on the LGC shall cease to hold office if a registered medical practitioner who is treating that person gives a written opinion to the Trust Board or the LGC stating that the person has become physically or mentally incapable of acting as a LGC member and may remain so for more than three months.
- A4.7.3. A person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC if:
- 4.7.3.1. their estate has been sequestered and the sequestration has not been discharged, annulled or reduced; or
 - 4.7.3.2. they are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or an interim order.
- A4.7.4 A person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC at any time when they are subject to a disqualification order or a disqualification undertaking under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986 or to an order made under section 429(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 (failure to pay under county court administration order).
- A4.7.5 A person serving on the LGC shall cease to hold office if they could not be a director by virtue of any provision in the Companies Act 2006 or are disqualified from acting as a trustee by virtue of sections 178 to 180 of the Charities Act 2011 (or any statutory re-enactment or modification of that provision).
- A4.7.6 A person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC if they have been removed from the office of charity trustee or trustee for a charity by an order made by the Charity Commission or the High Court on the grounds of any misconduct or mismanagement in the administration of the charity for which they were responsible or to which they were privy, or which they by their conduct contributed to or facilitated.
- A4.7.7 A person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC at any time when they are included in the children's barred list kept by the Disclosure and Barring Service under section 3(2) of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006, as amended.
- A4.7.8 A person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC if they are a person in respect of whom a direction has been made under section 142 of the Education Act 2002 as amended, or is subject to any prohibition or restriction which takes effect as if contained in such a direction.
- A4.7.9 A person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC where they have, at any time, been convicted of any criminal offence, excluding any that have been spent under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 as amended, and excluding any offence for which the maximum sentence is a fine or a lesser sentence except where a person has been convicted of any offence which falls under sections 178 to 180 of the Charities Act 2011.
- A4.7.10 After the academy has opened, a person shall be disqualified from serving on the LGC:
- 4.7.10.1 if they have not provided to the clerk a valid criminal records certificate relevant to the children's workforce at an enhanced disclosure level under section 113B of the Police Act 1997; or
 - 4.7.10.2 the certificate provided discloses any information which would in the opinion of the Designated Safeguarding Director confirm their unsuitability to work with children.
- A4.7.11 Where a person is notified of circumstances which disqualify him or her from serving on the LGC by virtue of the above sub-clauses, whether currently serving or proposed to so serve, they shall give written notice of that fact to the clerk who shall inform the LGC and the Directors, other than where the disqualification arises under clause A4.7.2 or A4.7.10.2 where the disqualified person shall be given written notice of that fact by the clerk, who shall also inform the LGC and the Directors.”
