I trust that you understand that we have taken all of the children into consideration when making these decisions and I can assure you that we will endeavour to ensure the children continue to receive excellent support at all times.

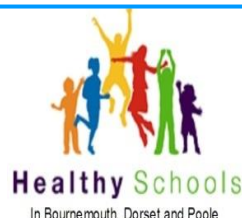
Parent Governor Needed!

Clerk to the Governors - Vacancy

The Governing Body is seeking to appoint an experienced administrator as Clerk to Governors. We are seeking a reliable, well organised individual that is able to work under own initiative to deadlines whilst providing administrative support to the Governing Body.

The successful candidate will be required to:

- Prepare and distribute agendas and enclosures for full governing body and committee meetings
- Take accurate and concise minutes
- Co-ordinate the governing body in an efficient manner
- Advise the governing body on legal, constitutional and procedural matters (training will be provided)
- Attend Clerk's briefing sessions and liaise with Dorset County Council's Governor Services Department
- Demonstrate good verbal and written communication skills

Training and on-going support in all aspects of the role will be available to you from Dorset County Council Governor Services Department.

With the exception of actual meetings, the majority of the role could be carried out in school or from home at a time to suit the post holder as preferred. There are currently 6 full governing body meetings and approximately 12 committee meetings per academic year. The job holder will need to be flexible with regard to working hours and days as this is dependent on the prescribed meeting schedule of the Governing Body. The salary for the role has been calculated as an average of 4 hours per week term time only, however the majority of the hours would be worked on and around the dates of the meetings.

Last Day of the Term including the Easter Service & Achievements Assembly

You are invited to join the school for the Easter Service at 9.15 am on Thursday 24 March at St Osmund's church in Evershot. Ladybirds, Little Acorns and Barn Owls will also be invited to join us for a community celebration of Easter. Following the service the school will be providing tea/coffee and hot cross buns in the Discovery Centre.

We will not be holding an Achievements' Assembly as well as the Easter Assembly however, there will then be a house competition which will include parents, further details will be provided nearer the time.
