Charging Policy

1. Introduction

- 1.1 All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum with the exception of individual or group music tuition. However we do ask for voluntary contribution towards the cost of transport.

Legal framework

This policy will have consideration for, and be compliant with, the following legislation and statutory guidance:

2. Voluntary contributions

- 2.1 When organising school trips or visits which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost of the trip. All contributions are voluntary. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may cancel a trip. If a trip goes ahead, it may include children whose parents have not paid any contribution. We do not treat these children differently from any others.
- 2.2 If a parent wishes their child to take part in a school trip or event, but is unwilling or unable to make a voluntary contribution, we do allow the child to participate fully in the trip or activity. Sometimes the school pays additional costs in order to support the visit. Parents have a right to know how each trip is funded. The school provides this information on request.
- 2.3 The following is a list of additional activities organised by the school, which require voluntary contributions from parents. These activities are known as 'optional extras'. This list is not exhaustive:
- Visits to museums, galleries, exhibitions etc
 - Sporting activities which require transport
 - Visits to the theatre
 - School trips abroad e.g. Lourdes
 - Musical events
 - Extracurricular clubs where the school has to pay for the coach or provider

3. Residential visits

- 3.1 If the school organises a residential visit in school time or mainly school time, which is to provide education directly related to the National Curriculum, we do not make any charge for the education. However, we do make a charge to cover the costs of board, lodging and travel expenses.

4. Music tuition

- 4.1 All children study music as part of the normal school curriculum. We do not charge for this.
- 4.2 There is a charge for individual or group music tuition if this is not part of the National Curriculum. The peripatetic music teachers who teach individual or small group lessons make a charge for this service.

5. Swimming

- 5.1 The school organises swimming lessons for all children in Y2. These take place in school time and are part of the National Curriculum. We ask for a contribution towards the transport for this activity if appropriate. However no child will be excluded if the parent is unable or unwilling to contribute. We inform parents when these lessons are to take place, and we ask parents for their written permission for their child to take part in swimming lessons.

Remission Statement

There will be occasions when families are placed under particular financial pressure. Parents are encouraged to discuss with the school their particular circumstances, confidentially, as they arise. The school will act sympathetically in these circumstances.
