Curriculum	Embedding the use the 'REAL PE' program to teach and develop pupils Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS) – agility, balance and coordination. The sessions also foster a positive attitude to sport, provide regular opportunities for healthy competition and enhance essential life skills. Dance and gymnastics are also taught by class teachers. Outdoor skills such as orienteering, climbing, caving and team activities are developed during residential visits in both Y4 and Y6. All new teaching staff will receive training in REAL PE to ensure consistently high quality T&L in PE.	
Curriculum (teacher release time)	<p>KS1 In KS1 pupils further develop REAL PE during PE sessions with sports coach.</p>	<p>KS2 We employ specialist coaches (Sport Explosion and Bristol Sport) to teach in KS2 for one session per class per week. Learning focuses on the traditional 'sports' such as football, cricket, hockey, netball, tennis, rugby etc. In addition pupils develop athletic skills and fitness.</p>
Competition/ Participation	<p><u>Inter School Competition:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Currently we attend a <u>minimum of 12 festivals/ tournaments</u> per year, which involves participation and competition alongside other local schools. Our competitions include matches against local schools (state and public). These include cross country, 'games', gymnastics, football, rugby, etc. • Everyone in KS1 and 2 competes against another school during our annual Redland Green School visits. • We annually take part in the 'Stages' dance festival and the gymnastic festival at county and regional level. <p><u>Intra school competition:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We hold an annual Sports Day where our house teams compete against one another. • Also every year KS1 hold an intra school sports event focused on a new activity. • KS2 go off site to experience outdoor/ alternative activities and take part in intra house sports competition. • Pupils take part in lunchtime tournaments in KS2 throughout the year. • All Real PE sessions (and most 'Sports' lessons) include an element of healthy competition. 	
School links	We work with local schools to improve opportunities to participate in sports, via the Wesport or St Bede's. We have developed a strong link with Redland Green School, three annual events for our pupils to attend every year, such events include coaching by their Y10/11 sports leaders.	
High quality CPD from specialist	We seek the best possible provision in PE for our learners via staff CPD. Most of our spending this year was focused on staff CPD, to improve the quality of teaching and increase pupil enjoyment.

coaches.	This year our EYFS and KS1 pupils and staff have received specialist PE teaching via the Bristol School of Gymnastics . All staff and pupils received specialist PE teaching/ CPD from Bristol Rugby and StreetFeet Dance . All KS1 and KS2 staff received specialist coaching and CPD from Bristol Tennis .	
After School Clubs	Currently we offer between 3 to 5 sporting activities per night after school for pupils to undertake. We have worked hard to ensure a range of sports are provided, at both our Worrall Road (2-4 per night) and Lower Redland Road site (1-2 per night). Both external providers and school staff lead clubs. We are constantly seeking views from parents and pupils on how to engage more pupils into sport. New clubs introduced in 2015 were StreetFeet dance, Table Tennis, Bristol Rugby (who teach a range of sports).	
Pupil led activities	<p>Junior Leaders 20 Y5/6 pupils have been trained to lead physical activities which can be accessed by all pupils in key stage 2.</p>	<p>Move it (Active club) Our SMSAs run this club focused on increasing physical activity, using engaging physical resources and play.</p>
Active Travel	We encourage our children to develop healthy and sustainable habits in travelling to school, through events such as Walk on Wednesday and the Big Pedal fortnight. Our pupils in Y4 and Y6 are given the opportunity to take part in both Level 1 and 2 Bike Ability sessions.	
Facilities	In 2015 we increased the number of pitches available from 1 to 2 for pupils to take part in physical activity. This doubles amount of lunchtime sport and after school clubs possible at our Worrall Road site. The pitches will allow PE lessons to continue to operate effectively through school expansion. In addition a trim trail and target practice area has increase the amount of physical activity at lunchtime. We received funding from Sustrans to improve our scooter and bike storage on site. We have installed an outdoor climbing wall and Snug equipment at our infant site.
