### **Overall PE Provision in School**

As a school we place great value on the physical, social, emotional and health benefits of developing participation in sporting activity. We achieve this through:

Curriculum	Class teachers teach use the ' <b>REAL PE</b> ' program to develop pupils Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS) – agility, balance and coordination. The sessions also foster a positive attitude to sport, provide regular opportunities for healthy competition and enhance essential life skills. Dance and gymnastics are also taught by class teachers. Outdoor skills such as orienteering, climbing, caving and team activities are developed during residential visits in both Y4 and Y6. All new teaching staff will receive training in REAL PE to ensure consistently high quality T&L in PE.	
Curriculum	KS1 In KS1 pupils further develop <b>REAL PE</b> during PE sessions.	KS2 We employ specialist coaches ( <b>Bristol Sports Foundation</b> ) to teach in KS2 for one session per class per week. Learning focuses on the traditional 'sports' such as football, cricket, hockey, netball, tennis, rugby etc. In addition pupils develop athletic skills and fitness.
<i>Competition</i>	Currently we attend a minimum of 10 festivals/ tournaments per year, which involves participation and competition alongside other local schools. Our competitions include matches against local schools (state and public). These include cross country, 'games', gymnastics, football, dance, cricket, tennis etc. We annually take part in the 'Stages' dance festival and the gymnastic festival. All Real PE sessions (and most 'Sports' lessons) include an element of healthy competition. Intra school competition: we hold an annual Sports Day where our house teams compete against one another. Also every year KS1 hold an intra school sports event focused on a new activity. KS2 go off site to experience outdoor/ alternative activities and take part in intra house team sports competitions at Clifton College. Around 60 pupils take part in lunchtime tournaments in KS2.	
School links	We work with local schools to improve opportunities to participate in sports, via the Wesport (Area) website or through cluster organised events (ran by St Bede's).	
Outreach	We seek the best possible provision in PE for our learners. This year our EYFS and KS1 pupils and staff have received specialist PE teaching via the Bristol School of Gymnastics.	
After School Clubs	Currently we offer between <b>5 to 8 sporting activities per night</b> after school for pupils to undertake. We have worked hard to ensure a range of sports are provided, at both our Worrall Road (3-5 per night) and Lower Redland Road site (2-3 per night). Both external providers and school staff lead clubs. We are constantly seeking views from parents and pupils on how to engage more pupils into sport.	
Pupil led activities	<b>Playground Leaders</b> – Y5/6 pupils trained up and lead lunchtime physical activities for our infant pupils.	<b>Move it (Active club)</b> Pupils and school staff run this club focused on increasing physical activity through a more play based approach.

Active Travel	In addition to PE we encourage our children to develop healthy and sustainable habits in travelling to school, through events such as Walk on Wednesday. Our pupils in Y4 and Y6 are given the opportunity to take part in both Level 1 and 2 Bike Ability sessions.
Facilities	In 2015 we increased the number of pitches available from 1 to 2 for pupils to take part in physical activity. This doubles amount of lunchtime sport and after school clubs possible within the site. The pitches will allow PE lessons to continue to operate effectively through school expansion. In addition a trim trail and target practice area has increase the amount of physical activity at lunchtime. We received funding from Sustrans to improve our scooter and bike storage on site. We have installed an outdoor climbing wall at our infant site. We have high level climbing equipment (the Nexus) at Worrall Road and a cricket net practice area.
