

School Impact Reviews:

School St Julian's Primary

Term 1

Data:

Premier Sport have currently delivered **21** hours of curriculum physical education, alongside **14** hours of extracurricular sport active after school sessions, **7** hours of stay active lunchtime clubs and 10 hours of FUN-trition. As well as this Premier have supported the delivery of an after-school netball club driven towards preparing children for competition.

Premier Sport have delivered curricular sessions to **113** pupils up until this date which accounts for **100%** of the school engaging in physical activity for a prolonged period of time on a weekly basis.

Premier Sport funded sport-active after school clubs have had average numbers of **14 per session for cross country** in term 1. These clubs have run at **82%** of full capacity showing the popularity and willingness of the children to engage in the varied sporting opportunity offered. The attendance has been high at **91%** on average each week. We have seen a real mix of attendees of the after-school clubs with lots of different ages, **80%** are boys and **20%** girls. The behaviour and achievement levels throughout the after-school program have always been very high as well, with all children improving their running ability.

Premier Sport stay active lunchtime clubs have had average numbers of **16 children** per day with fencing working well and giving the children the chance to engage in a new sport and now be able to effectively compete against each other. The attendance of these clubs has been almost **100%** each week and they have run at **78%** capacity. **42%** attending have been girls and **58%** boys showing that there is much more of a balance in the lunch time sessions.

During the FUN-trition sessions, learning has been demonstrated and engagement has been high and we have taken feedback on board to run more active sessions moving forward to further encourage learning. We will have some more data for FUN-trition at the end of term 2.

Assessment:

The focus on curricular sessions this year so far has been **Invasion games (netball) for key stage 2 and in key stage 1 the focus has been on fundamentals of movement (ABC's) for term 1**. Throughout the curricular sessions Premier Sport Activity Professionals have been monitoring and assessing children. In the school at this exact time they have assessed **100%** of the children and the results of these assessments can be seen below:

When comparing the data from this school year to the previous there have been many increases from expected to exceeding and excelling. Although we have a slight increase of students in the reflective establishing column the expected and exceeding rates for this area have remained similar.

During this term students have produced high levels of competency which can be seen by the assessments (increase of 9% of students exceeding). It has been identified during High 5 Netball sessions students have struggled to identify, remember and/or explain positions. This has seen the establishing reflective rates increase to 17% which is an area we will be looking to improve on during Term 2. The behaviour rates at St Julian's have a total of 52% of students achieving exceeding levels of above (24% increase from Term 1 2017).

During term 2 our aim is to:

- Reduce the percentage rate of students in the reflective establishing area.
- Increase the engagement rates of expected or above by 10%
