<p>To continue to ensure all PP children achieve in line with their peers with quality first teaching and interventions when appropriate</p> <p>To develop growth mindset in school with a particular focus on PP children, to continue to build self-esteem and resilience alongside peers.</p> <p>To ensure all PP children access the same extra-curricular activities as peers, enhancing social skills and allowing for a range of experiences.</p>	<p>Classroom teachers use quality First Teaching to identify any children with gaps in their learning and use specific classroom intervention and support. All PP children have books marked first and have targeted questioning in place during lessons.</p> <p>PP money was used to fund training for a Teaching assistant for a counselling course and a mindfulness course. This was to help support with interventions for confidence and mentoring adopted children.</p> <p>PP grant used to fund extra curricular activities, including all class trips, residential, cookery club and a 30% payment towards music lessons.</p>	<p>Up until school closed due to the pandemic all of the children were at least meeting age related expectations, with 25% at GD for reading, writing and math.</p> <p>Worry boxes were introduced after the training, and new 'chat time' sessions were organized around some of the PP children. These will need to be continued due to the Pandemic inhibiting the length of the intervention.</p>	<p>Funding allocated to cover the costs of extra-curricular activities that peers were attending, this allowed the further development of positive relationships within school.</p> <p>Issues around confidence and self-esteem were emerging towards the end of the year. This was beginning to be worked on through the TA training in mindfulness and counselling, however this was not sustained due to the pandemic closing of school.</p> <p>Throughout the lockdown of school teachers were talking to their PP pupils on a regular basis. SLT conducted check in phone calls to monitor and ensure they had resources to work at home.</p>
