There are just a few regular routines that we would like to share with you in order to ensure a smooth start to each day:

- The children will need a drink bottle for the classroom which is accessible to them throughout the day. If your child has a packed lunch, please ensure that they have a separate drink bottle inside their lunchbox.
- Please ensure the book bags are in school every day in order that we can send home reading books and any other important communications. If you have not done so yet, there is still time to register for Parentmail.
- As a school we encourage healthy eating and we are proud to have gained a Healthy Schools Award. For morning playtime the children will need a piece of fruit which should be placed in their tray as they arrive at school. We also have a snack time in the afternoons but the fruit for this is provided through the Government scheme to encourage children to eat their 5 a day.
- The children look so smart in their uniforms. Thank you for making sure that each item of uniform, PE kits, lunchboxes and water bottles are clearly labelled. This has already been extremely useful, especially at the end of the day!

Our main PE lesson will take place on Thursday afternoon and we will be encouraging the children to be as independent as possible when they are getting changed. PE kits will stay in school until the half term break.

We look forward to getting to know the children better over the coming days and establishing our classroom routines in order to create the best possible learning environment for every child.
