## HEAD LICE

Can we remind parents to check their child's hair on a weekly basis for head lice.

This can be done simply by applying conditioner to wet hair and combing through using a nit comb, checking as you go. If head lice are found continue with this method every three days for two weeks. Always use fresh water to rinse afterwards so you do not re-infect the hair. If no lice are found continue to check each week. Thank you.
