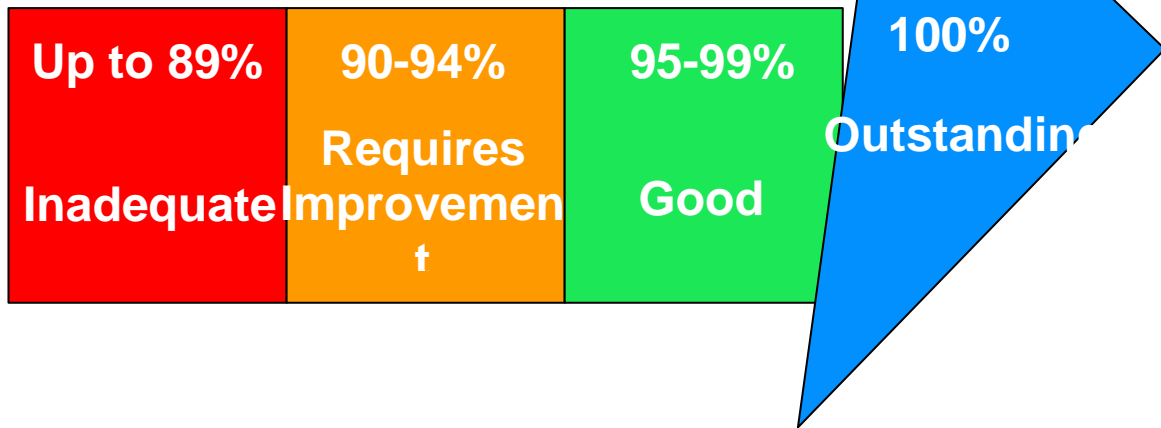




Our Attendance so far: 95.28%
