



Dear Parents and Carers,

At the time that this letter is being written we are in the fortunate position within school that we have had no positive Covid cases with our staff team or our children. So as of today (17.11.20) – no bubbles have popped!

However family members, mums and dads, have tested positive, meaning that children from those families have self-isolated at home. In this situation the bubble remains in school. Find below information about supporting home learning.

If individual children are self-isolating at home due to a family member testing positive :-

Teachers and bubbles would remain in school.

The parent/carer who has informed school that their child is self-isolating, will receive a brief call from the class teacher to support home learning. Teachers will direct parents to the appropriate Oak Academy units of work and highlight the RE home learning topic to be completed from our website. Google classroom homework, daily reading and full access to our Home learning page on our website should be accessed by all parents/carers of children who are self-isolating.

If a bubble is sent home , following advice from Public health England:-

In the case that the class teacher remains well, we would ask you to read our Remote learning policy on the front page of our website. The policy details the teaching that would continue to take place at this time, via Google classroom. There is no expectation for children to complete this work if they are ill.

If the class teacher is however poorly, we would need to ask parents to use the detail above, related to an individual child self- isolating. We would endeavour to contact parents with more tailored support, however this would depend upon capacity within school.

We hope that this information is useful. We continue to work hard to keep each other safe at these challenging times, while supporting learning at home or in school.
