Day	Literacy Book Focus: Jack and the Beanstalk	
<p>Monday</p> <p><i>Focus: Understanding the story and what has been read.</i></p>	<p>Read Jack and the Beanstalk. (I will upload a video of myself reading the story for your child to listen to).</p> <p>Talk about the story with your child. Ask them what happened at the beginning of the story. What happened at the end? What was at the top of the beanstalk? What did Jack steal from the giant? What happened to the beanstalk in the end?</p>	
<p>Tuesday</p>	<p>Wanted poster for Jack by the giant You could re-read the story if you'd like... repetition helps with your child's understanding of how stories are structured, develops their language and love of reading!</p> <p>Main: Jack has stolen something from the giant! What has he stolen? Can you create a wanted poster for Jack? Today I'd like you to draw a picture of Jack. Think about what he looks like – his hair, what he might be wearing, etc. Colour it in when you have finished!</p>	
<p>Wednesday</p>	<p>Wanted poster for Jack Talk about the story again. Discuss who the main characters are, what are the main plot points in the story, what happens at the end, is it happy or sad?</p> <p>Main: Now you've drawn your picture of Jack for the wanted poster, can you write a description for the police to help them find him? You will need to use adjectives to describe Jack. Adjectives are describing words, they tell you something about the person or thing you're talking about, for example, tall, thin, dirty. Can you add labels to your drawing that describe Jack? Use your phonics to sound out the words.</p>	<p>Extra challenge: Can you use full sentences to write your description? Remember finger spaces and full stops.</p>
<p>Additional learning experiences:</p>	<p>Understanding the World: Plant a seed a watch it grow! This week we will also be looking at what plants need to grow and what happens when they do grow? We will be planting beans and talking about how to keep it alive and a very simple version of a plant life cycle.</p> <p>Art: Make your own beanstalk</p>
