English

Our story this week is: Oliver and the Seawigs by Philip Reeve and Sarah McIntyre.

We will be continuing to follow our school English scheme 'Power of Reading'. I have uploaded daily planning and activities for children to do based on this story. Upload your completed activities to our class dojo page.

Here are some additional activities you might want to do:

- Oliver and his parents have travelled on the explorer mobile, can you design your own explorer mobile and describe the features that it has?
- Could you make a magazine advert for a holiday to the island? How could you describe it to visitors to make them want to go on holiday there?
- Can you imagine any other explorer trips that Oliver and his parents have been on and write a short story about it? Here are some ideas of where they could have visited to get you started:
 - An underwater city
 - A different planet
 - A cave full of human-size bugs
 - In the sky, jumping on the clouds
 - You can choose any place that you can think of, it can either be one of the above or one you have thought of yourself! How did Oliver and his parents get there, what happens when they get there and what do they see?

Mathematics

Our focus this week is decimals

Here are some additional activities you might want to do:

- Continue to do Times Table Rockstars, see if you can move up a level!
- Using a ruler or a tape measure can you measure different objects around your house and then write them in size order. Be accurate and use cms and mms, e.g. 4.7cm
- Use different lego colours for ones, tenths, hundredths and thousandths, can you put different amounts of lego in each section and then write them as a decimal?
- Count up the money in your house, what would you need to add to have £10, £50 etc. Find the cost of some things that you want to buy, can you work out how much more money is needed? Remember, we're working with decimals like £5.24
- This website has some good games to practice your decimals, the best ones for this week are compare decimals and decimal demonstrator.

- Think about the changes that happen in spring, we see a lot more flowers and plants. Can you draw any that you see in your garden or on your daily walk? What do plants and flowers need to grow and survive? Can you name any parts of a flower?
