

Pupil Premium

What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is a sum of money which is paid to the school to support your child during their time at school.

Children who are on or have been in receipt of Free School Meals within the last 6 years or children whose parents are in the Armed Forces are eligible for the funding.

How the Funding will be used in this School:

The funding can be used to support your child in the following ways:

- Extra-curricular sports activities;
- Music lessons
- School visits
- Swimming with School
- Provision of learning resources and specific learning programmes in school.

How can parents and carers contribute to the success of the Pupil Premium Scheme?

If your child is eligible for free school meals, it is worth registering them even if they're not going to have a school lunch or Your child is in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 at present. It will have a direct impact on the funding and will maximize the support we can provide.

PUPIL PREMIUM 2017-18

This year we have been allocated £1,320

This will be used again to support extra staffing to enable support to be given in maths catch up programme and spelling /reading activities. Extra resources will also be purchased to enable the child to make progress in particular reading.

PUPIL PREMIUM 2016/17

For the academic year 2016/17 we have an allocation of £1,320. This money will be used to support extra staffing to ensure that pupils concerned will continue to make the same standard of progress as their peers, in particular in reading and writing. Where necessary extra resources will be purchased to support the new curriculum.

Impact

This funding has enabled a teaching assistant to support a child to pre teach some aspects of the curriculum to help the pupil make progress in line with their peers and achieve their age related expectations in English and maths.

PUPIL PREMIUM 2015/16

The level of Pupil Premium in 2015-16 is £1320. Our school allocation is £2640. At present this money is being used to provide extra Teaching Assistant hours to support children in class with Reading and Writing activities. Extra reading resources have been purchased to help pupils make progress. Money is also being used to fund trips and clubs and school swimming activities.

Impact 2015/16

The children who have received PP this year have made progress in line with their peers.

This has been measured through the use of the statutory testing of the SATs and Phonic Screening.

The money can no longer be used to help with swimming lesson costs

The way that we use the PP grant will be reviewed in September 2016.

PUPIL PREMIUM 2014/15

In 2014-15 the level of Pupil Premium is £1300 per pupil known to be eligible. Our School allocation is £2,600. These monies have been used to provide extra support in the classroom during the school day, pay for trips and clubs for the children in receipt of the grant and school swimming activities.

Impact 2014/15

Children in receipt of Pupil Premium have made the same level of progress as their peers in Reading, Writing and Maths. Extra support has been given during lessons as well as extra resources being used to allow the children to make this progress.

PUPIL PREMIUM 2013/14

In 2013- 14 the level of Pupil Premium is £900 per pupil known to be eligible. Our School allocation is £900. At present this is being used to support school swimming activities and the allocation of extra resources within a class.

Impact 2013/14

Pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium have been able to join in with visits and swimming activities, as well as using extra resources that allowed them to make good progress in Reading and Writing.
