Family Worship

Each year group will lead whole school worship during the autumn and spring terms. These take place on a Thursday and aim to start close to 9am. Families are very welcome to attend these. In the summer term we celebrate the individual achievements of each child with a special end of year celebration service where we hand out special certificates. In addition to this there are three services a year at church which, again, families are very welcome to attend. All the dates for the family worship will be sent home next week and will also be available soon on the school website in the Google calendar section.

Newsletters, Texts, Calendar and Twitter

Towards the end of last year, we sent home a form linked to our data management GDPR policy. Each Friday we will send out a newsletter. The vast majority of our parents have asked to receive this via email. We have a list of parents who have asked to receive a paper copy of the newsletter and will continue to send this out during this year. I have added a reply slip to the bottom of this newsletter for any new parents who would prefer to receive the newsletter in a paper form.

In addition to our newsletters we use a text messaging service and a private Twitter account to send messages and celebrate achievements. This is accessible to parents and carers or current pupils. Our address is @cragsideprimary. If you do not yet follow us, please log in to Twitter and follow us so you can see some of the day to day work and celebrations that happen at Cragside.

Our Reception classes also use a program called Tapestry to share the learning of our youngest children. Please would it be possible to let the office know if you change your email address or mobile telephone number so we can ensure we have the correct contact details to ensure you receive texts and newsletters. If you have any queries, please see Mr Davidson or Miss Westgarth and they will be really happy to help. Alternatively, catch me on the school gate and I will try to help.

Start and End of the School Day

Thank you for your help with the start and end of the school day. A reminder for our new parents that the school doors open each morning at 8.40am for children to come into school and start their morning maths activities whilst the register is being taken. If the doors are closed (i.e. after 8.50am) please would you bring your child to the main school Office to be signed into school. The external gate on the school yard, Reception gates and the garden gates are all locked just after 8.50am so the site is secure through the day. To help with safety, please would it be possible to mention at the start of the year:

- Dogs are not allowed on the school grounds.
- Parking restrictions are in place in the streets closest to the school. On Westloch Road this is between 8.30am-9.30am and 2.45pm-3.45pm. Other streets such as Gainsborough Place are designated residents only streets. The whole estate is a 20mph zone. Thank you for avoiding parking in the streets close to school.
- The whole site, including near the school gates, is a non-smoking area (this includes e-cigarettes).
- Mobile phones should not be used to photograph or record in the school grounds.
- Children should dismount from scooters and bicycles before coming into the school grounds.
- If children play on the play equipment at the start and end of the day, please would parents supervise them to check they are safe. Thank you so much for all your help in ensuring the children are safe at the start and end of the school day.

Attendance and Punctuality-A Message from Mrs Parker

We have been delighted to see our children arriving at school so promptly this week. There is an awful lot of evidence which clearly shows that excellent attendance and punctuality positively impacts upon a child's success with learning, enabling them to achieve well and be the very best that they can be. Like all parents and carers, as a school, we have a shared responsibility to ensure that children attend school regularly and promptly. To support us with this, we work closely with our Education Welfare Officer, whom we regularly meet with to monitor the attendance and punctuality of all children in school.

Where your child does need to be absent from school, please contact the School Office on 01670 714200, before 9am, giving the name of the child who is absent and the reason for absence, on each day of the child's absence. If you do not contact the school the absence will have to be recorded as unauthorised. Each week, we will be celebrating the classes who have the best attendance in each phase of school (Early Years, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2) and these classes are rewarded with a certificate to display on their door and an Attendance trophy to keep in their class.

as getting to know each other! In Maths we have been sorting and counting objects, finding one more and one less. In English we have enjoyed reading the story Class 2 At The Zoo by Julia Jarman, and retelling the story in our own words. We're looking forward to starting our Geography and DT topic next week - please see our curriculum map for more details! Well done Year One on your fabulous start to our year together!

Year 2 have had a wonderful start to the year. It has been wonderful to see so many smiling faces in the morning. The Year 2 children have settled in very well and been setting a good example whilst helping the Year 1 children to get used to their new surroundings in Key Stage 1. In lessons the children have been learning about place value and counting using tens and ones as well as completing some addition and subtraction work. We have been very impressed with their attitude to learning and their knowledge. In English the children have started the book Silly Billy, which is all about a young boy who worries about everything. We have used the story to talk about our own worries and relate to the main character. The children also came up with some excellent suggestions on how to tackle our worries and thoughts about all we are looking forward to. It's been a great start to Year 2 and it is lovely to see all the children thriving and enjoying school. News from Lower Key Stage 2




The Year 3 and 4 children have made a really great start to the year. We are so impressed with the mature attitude and great behaviour they have shown over the first week. It is great to see that they have returned to school so ready to learn.

In Year 3 the children have been working on number and place value in maths. They have thought about the question 'What is 100?' They counted in 100s and solved problems linked to this. The children then thought about place value and used base 10 equipment to make different numbers. In English the children have started reading a non-fiction text about Tutankhamun. In Year 4 we have begun this year by exploring Roman Numerals in maths. The children have been fantastic at this. In English Year 4 have been applying for class jobs using all their persuasive writing skills.

In Lower Key Stage 2 we have decided to do homework slightly differently this year. Each half term we will send home 'bingo homework' tasks. The children should attempt to complete as many of these as they can during the half term. We will keep a record of this in school and children who complete all 9 tasks will receive a certificate. We want to encourage the children to be as creative as they can with this homework and look forward to sharing it with the class. Thank you for supporting your child with thiswe couldn't do it without you! Our teachers in Year 3/4 this year are Mrs Cant, Miss McVicar, Mrs Harper, Mrs Cowie and Mr Flynnwood.

News from Upper Key Stage 2-A Message from Mrs Bilton





In Year 6, we have started our maths lessons by thinking about Place Value; we've worked confidently with 7 and 8 digit numbers. The children have really impressed us by applying their knowledge and skills to a range of problems and investigations. In English, we've started to read the award winning novel Eye of The Wolf. This challenging text is absolutely beautiful and ensures the children develop a range of higher order reading comprehension skills. In PHSE, we've thought about the rights and responsibilities we have in our new classes, and in RE we have written prayers for class prayer stations. Year 6 have also spent time preparing for the visit from Archbishop of York John Sentamu. The children were fascinated to find out about his work and his life and were absolutely delighted to spend time asking him questions and listening to his stories. What a privilege it was to meet him and what a credit the children were in terms of their behaviour and attitude.

Well done to Year 5, who have quickly settled back into the school routine and shown that they are more than ready for upper key stage 2. It has certainly been a busy first week back! In our English lessons, we have been enjoying the novel Friend or Foe by Michael Morpurgo. Based on the book, we have written a diary entry in role as David the main character, looked for clues within a text and created a role play based on one of the scenes. In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting five digit numbers, investigated Roman numerals and practised different mental methods. In History, we have begun our study of the Anglo Saxons, learning who they were, why they invaded Britain and what their main kingdoms were. Well done Year 5 - a great start to the year. Our teachers in Year 5/6 this year are Mrs Bilton, Miss Rennison, Mrs Harper, Miss Hebdon, Mr Davidson and Mrs Forrest.

If you require a password to pay online please contact the school office and they will happily help you with this.

A leaflet is available from the school office for information on the Out of School Club. This runs before and after school to try and support families where after school care is needed. Information about payments and times can be accessed from the main school office or information is also available on the school website.

If your child is going to be absent from school please contact the school office each morning before 9.30am. An answer phone is available for any messages that need to be left before 8.30am. If you need a leave of absence form for your child, please would you collect one from the school office. School is unable to authorise any term time holiday requests.
