Employ a specialist PE Teacher as subject leader for 6 hours per week.	To enhance provision and long-term sustainability, in providing access that encourages healthy, active lifestyles for all pupils. To provide access to a wider range of competition and after-school sport. To co-ordinate PE opportunities with other Alnwick partnership schools, including membership of the East Northumberland Schools Football League.	£6000	Pupils throughout school have benefitted from high quality PE and sports teaching, delivered by a teacher who knows all pupils well and can support their needs appropriately. A KS1 after-school club was attended by 41% of pupils in the Autumn Term. A team of Y5/6 pupils competed in the North Northumberland Schools Football League.
