Any local rules implemented by the Local Action Committee to re-introduce the wider wearing of face coverings due to a local outbreak of Covid are followed.</p> <p>Face coverings are worn by members of staff and visitors in areas outside the classroom where social distancing is not possible (e.g. Corridors). Staff wear face coverings in classrooms as their discretion.</p> <p>Face coverings are worn by pupils when travelling on dedicated school transport.</p> <p>The school will provide a disposable face covering to anyone one who needs one.</p> <p><u>Risk Assessment</u> This risk assessment has been undertaken in light of national guidance in relation to the use of face covering in schools and with consideration to the following [some of the controls below may only be relevant during times when the wider use of face coverings are recommended for pupils/staff/visitors]:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> National/local rules in place [review RA when these change] The ages of the young people within the 		<p>[Perspex face visors/face shields are not an adequate substitution as they are unlikely to offer protection against aerosol transmission and therefore would need to be worn alongside a face covering].</p> <p>Out of School Settings</p> <p>Face coverings are to be used where it is a requirement of an indoor setting and where the activity is taking place in an area in which children in year 7 and above or staff are likely to come into contact with other members of the public and/or where social distancing cannot easily be maintained.</p> <p>When delivering education and training, including extra-curricular activities and wraparound childcare, in a community setting (for example, library or community centre), staff and pupils are exempt from the legal requirement to wear a face covering if they are in a private room or the premises has been exclusively hired for the sole use of its pupils and staff.</p>

			<p>establishment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The layout of the building makes it difficult to maintain social distancing. These areas have been assessed and are identified in this assessment [record details]. • The inability to stagger timetables/breaks/lunch to reduce the flow of pupils in communal areas, such as busy corridors/stairwells etc, at times when there is significant pupil movement. This will include arrival and departure times. • The likelihood of contact with other persons or pupils outside of an established cohort group. • Queuing for school transport. • Individual needs of pupils, including their ability to cope with face coverings, apply them safely or to be able to communicate effectively. • To assist in managing high levels of anxiety amongst pupils, parents and staff. <p>The control measures within the risk assessment are monitored regularly to ensure compliance and the risk assessment is kept under review and shared with staff.</p>

This process should be clearly communicated with staff and pupils with clear instructions on how to put on, remove, store and dispose of face coverings. The process should also cover:</p> <p><i>Who is required to wear a face covering and when they should wear it.</i></p> <p><i>Ensuring the cleaning of hands before putting the face covering on and after taking the face covering off.</i></p> <p><i>Hand sanitiser is provided in classrooms and pupils are supervised in its use.</i></p>	<p>School to maintain a supply of sealable plastic bags.</p> <p>See Guidance on arrangement for disposal of waste</p> <p>World Health Organisation (WHO) - 'How to wear a fabric mask safely' video</p>

			<p><i>Safe storage in individual, sealable plastic bags between use.</i></p> <p><i>Arrangements to prevent the use of coverings which are inappropriate, soiled, damp or damaged etc.</i></p> <p><i>Where <u>disposable</u> face coverings are worn these should be put into a bin bag in a non-recyclable bin (general waste) after use.</i></p>		
<p><i>Individuals not wearing a face covering</i></p>	<p>All staff, pupils, visitors</p> <p><i>Potential exposure to live virus resulting in contracting Coronavirus.</i></p> <p><i>Inadvertent transmission to others.</i></p>		<p><i>Parents should provide face coverings for pupils. If pupils who are required to wear a face covering forget or are unable to provide one, the school has communicated alternative arrangements to parents, such as providing a disposable or reusable face covering.</i></p> <p><i>The establishment holds a stock of disposable face coverings for use by staff and pupils where needed.</i></p> <p><i>Arrangements for receiving visitors should be amended to ensure they wear face coverings where appropriate.</i></p>		<p><i>Staff will already have access to face coverings of their choice for use in the community and these can be worn in school. If for any reason staff (or pupils if relevant) don't have access to a face covering, education settings should take steps to have a small contingency supply available to meet such needs.</i></p> <p><i>Some individuals are exempt from wearing face coverings. For example people who cannot put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment, or disability, or if you are speaking to or providing assistance to someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression to communicate.[transparent face coverings can be worn in this circumstance although evidence surrounding effectiveness in transmission of Covid is limited] The same exemptions will apply in education settings, and teachers and other staff should be sensitive to those needs.</i></p>

<p><i>Failure to communicate requirements for face coverings</i></p>			<p><i>A risk assessment has been undertaken to determine when and where face coverings should be worn. The outcome of this assessment has been communicated to all staff, pupils and parents and measures are in place to monitor and, where necessary, enforce compliance.</i></p> <p><i>Communications have been approved by the senior management team and issued as appropriate.</i></p>	<p><i>Pupils (and parents)/staff have been reminded of the importance of ensuring face coverings are worn, when needed, and handled correctly and that hand hygiene is practised before and after touching a face covering. This is supported by the class teacher.</i></p>
