Learning Achievements

Reception: this week we have been looking at different endings to fairy tales and describing 2D and 3D shapes.

Class 1: this week we have been continuing work on pictograms and place value. We have created a story map to create our own story linked to the story 'The Tunnel'.

Class 2: this week the children have been reading list poems. Using the same structure and borrowing ideas, they created their own list poem about metals. The poetry could include alliteration, repeated words or phrases and rhyming couplets. In Maths we have been converting centimetres to metres, calculating the perimeter of different rectilinear shapes and writing decimals as fractions. The children played and evaluated their board games and, judging by the enjoyment from the children, most games were extremely successful.
