

Hipsburn Primary School – Primary PE Funding 2018/19

Under the Primary PE & Sport funding initiative, in 2018/19 we will receive £17,061 to improve PE and sport in our school.

The impact of the funding must be considered in terms of:

- delivery of high quality PE lessons
- participation and success in competitive school sport
- a broader range of activities on offer
- personal health and well-being of pupils
- promoting pupil activity through involvement in organised games at breaks and lunchtime.
- improved attitudes and behaviour towards learning

We have used a mixture of reflections and information from 2017-2018 to inform our plan for the new budget. These reflections include the school development plan alongside the feedback from parents in their end of school review, the school council and informal feedback from pupils and staff after each of the activities.

Our vision for 2018-2019:

- Continued development of staff confidence and knowledge and understanding in their planning and delivery of PE.
- Further develop Assessment Criteria for new National Curriculum
- Develop opportunity further for G&T pupils and provide an increased level of competition to continue to develop their performance levels.
- Continue to develop further inter-school competition/matches with local Primary Schools in the Alnwick Partnership for all pupils and G&T pupils.
- Continue to develop festivals for all key stages.
- Further develop informal breaktime and lunchtime activities with Sports Crew leading.
- Work closely with the Sports Crew to develop and target Healthy Lifestyles.
- Continue to develop active lunchtime and after-school clubs.
- Continue to develop intra-school house competitions half-termly with Sports Crew involvement
- Continue to develop new links with local clubs to increase pupil involvement.
- Continue to develop pupil success in Level One and Two in Sainsbury's School Games.
- Achieve Award of at least SILVER Sainsbury's School Games.
- Further develop KS2 links for Year 6 transition.

Therefore we propose to spend this money in the following ways:

- Continue to employ a specialist PE teacher to work alongside the PE Subject Leader and Class Teachers to develop high quality PE lessons, inter and intra school competitions as well as to run after school sports clubs in a range of sports including basketball, hockey, gymnastics, fun fitness, rounders, tennis and athletics.

The PE specialist will work with predominantly the older children (Year 3 to Year 6) but also have opportunities with Reception and KS1 to support and develop the planning and resourcing for the delivery of the PE curriculum with their class teachers.

The PE teacher will also support the class teacher and Mini-leaders to develop playtimes and lunch times for all the children.

The PE specialist will also help run active afterschool clubs opened to all pupils and ranging in a variety of sports.

In addition there will also be opportunities with:

- Specialist Invasion Games / Ball Skills and Rugby coaching for KS1 and KS2 Summer '18, Autumn '19 and Spring '19 = £800

- Specialist Cricket Coach for KS1 / KS2 Summer '18 = £400

- Supporting transport and entering competitions to Interschool's festivals for Year 1 – Year 6 fixtures including opportunities like Skipping festival and Mini Leader Training. = £800

- Supporting transport for Swimming KS2 (and cost of lifesaving) = £1000

- Developing outdoor learning – Beach School = £3000

- Purchase of PE / Sports equipment = £5000

We will regularly monitor the impact of our spending and may adjust the activities we provide accordingly.
