KS2 Tag Rugby Curriculum Coaching (Cramlington Rockets)	✓Y3/Y4/Y5/6	Good engagement and enjoyment of pupils. 24 Y6 pupils and 20 Y4 pupils attended School Games competition – this was a positive experience with both year groups winning some of their games.
Dance CPD (Cheryl Day of Creative Dance NE) – ½ day training and ½ term curriculum support	✓KS1	All pupils were engaged in PE lessons, especially the Y2 boys. Sessions were well differentiated for Year 1 and 2 pupils. After working alongside Cheryl with KS1, RW used the skills learnt to deliver new schemes of work – these schemes were developed alongside class-based topics and worked successfully. The profile of dance has increased in Northburn during 2016-17 with teachers across the school incorporating Go Noodle/Cybercoach into daily routines. 2 Y6 girls were identified by Cheryl Day as potentially talented and were invited to attend auditions. They were successful and performed at Gateshead Dance Festival at The Sage.
Newcastle United Foundation PLSSP (12 week programme multiskills for KS1 and KS2 after school club)	✓ KS1 and KS2	The whole Key Stage were engaged and enjoyed the sessions. Observation of the sessions allowed teacher to identify achievement in pupils and several pupils stood out where they hadn't shone before. The range of activities allowed all pupils to achieve and show improvement – they were all keen to try and all children showed good progress in basic skills and control. Children using activity ideas in other settings and keen to play some of the games (eg at KS1 playtimes they were asking if they could play the tag games). Three KS1 teachers developed skills which were transferable across a range of PE units. Thirty children attended an after school football club in which they improved their gross motor skills and teamwork. Ten of these children had never played football competitively and have been inspired trial at local clubs.
Chance to Shine Cricket Programme – Northumberland Cricket Board	✓	All children really enjoyed the lessons and enjoy additional opportunities to play cricket. Their batting confident improved the most. TH and RW saw a variety of learning activities which can be used in other PE lessons and extra-curricular cricket.

Y2 Multiskills Festivals – 43 x Y2, 45 Y5/6 Sports Leaders	✓43 + 16 leaders	Y2 children enjoyed the activities and competing/participating with children from other schools. Activities were used afterwards in planning for KS1 PE lessons. The Y6 Sports Leaders gained confidence and a sense of responsibility and it developed their communication skills, especially noticeable in the middle/lower ability pupils. This event in the Autumn term kick started the playtime sports leaders programme for the year.
Y3 Hula Hooping Festivals – 43 x Y3	✓43	All pupils enjoy hula hooping at playground. KS2 enjoyed hula hooping as part of their PE lessons and were excited whenever there was the opportunity. More hula hoops have been ordered for the playground.
Y3 Cricket Festivals – 43 x Y3	✓	3 pupils are now going to the All Stars Cricket activity at Cramlington Cricket Club.
Y3 Tony Blair Sports Foundation Tennis Competition	✓	Year 3 won the competition and represented Cramlington Seaton Valley in the area tournament at North Tyneside Tennis academy. Five pupils went on to attend extra-curricular tennis sessions led by coach from Cramlington Community Tennis Programme.
Y4 Tag Rugby Festivals – 45 x Y4	✓45	Fun morning and opportunity to work with pupils from other schools. Children were keen to take part in rugby coaching as part of their PE curriculum later in the year and seventeen children attended an extra-curricular club run by Cramlington Rockets.
Y5 Skipping Festival	✓	The preparation for this event meant that pupils were very active both in PE lessons and the playground, as they practised the skills. Boost the confidence of pupils who were initially unable to skip, but over the course of the preparation they learnt how

		to, every child could skip by the competition. Thirty two children attended after school skipping club for ten weeks.
Y5 Cricket Festival – 44 x Y5	✓	Fun activities, enjoyed by the pupils. Opportunity to meet children from other schools. Good activity ideas which could be used back in school when teaching cricket in PE lessons or at an extra-curricular club.
Y6 Newcastle United Foundation U11 Competition	✓	Ten children attended the NU Foundation competition and played football competitively against five other schools.
Y5/6 Newcastle Eagles Basketball Competition – 16 x Y5/6	✓16	Children demonstrated good teamwork gained from their experience of competition. The increase in confidence and communication skills was evident afterwards in the classroom.
Y6 CLV PE Transition	✓	This was a good experience and pupils had the opportunity to work alongside CLV sports leaders, soon to be their peers and gave them aspiration for what they might achieve in the next couple of years. Good chance to work alongside other Y6 pupils and to familiarise with the CLV PE department ready for transition.

Y3/4 Gymnastics x 12 children	✓	One pupil started going to a community gymnastics club. Northburn competed at Northern gymnastics academy and won the competition from ten schools. We had a six week after school club to prepare for the competition.
Y3/4 Tri-Golf x 30 children	✓1	This competition was a good opportunity for children who might not normally get the chance to go to a sports competition. Everyone enjoyed the event, showing good teamwork skills, cheering each other on, and they were excited about the event when we got back to school.
Y3/4 Tag Rugby x 20	✓2	The children loved competing against other teams. The less confident pupils/those who don't normally get a chance gained a lot of confidence and teamwork skills and this really helped 5 pupils in particular. Three talented pupils were identified and have since joined Cramlington Rockets rugby club.
Y4 Tennis x 16	✓2	Twelve week coaching by Cramlington Community Tennis. Five pupils were identified as talented by coaches. One team won the morning tennis tournament. Three children have since started attending Cramlington Community Tennis.
Y5 Boys' Football x 10	✓1	Ten children attended Cramlington Seaton Valley 7 a-side competition and won. They represented our area at the Northumberland School Games. It was an enjoyable experience.
Y5 Hockey x 12	✓2	Children enjoyed this as it was a new activity to them all. They played really well and learnt a lot, showing good improvement throughout the games. They celebrated

		their wins with good team spirit and were very mature in victory. Both teams won their groups, Team A represented our area at the Northumberland School Games.
Y5/6 Girls' Football x 9	✓1	Children enjoyed this as it was a new activity to them all. They played really well and learnt a lot, showing good improvement throughout the games. They celebrated their wins with good team spirit and were very mature in the matches they didn't win. The team had six weeks coaching prior to the competition as none of them had played football before and since, two have gone on to trial for local clubs.
Y5/6 Tag Rugby x 24	✓2	The children loved competing against other teams with one of our teams reaching the semi-final and the other team reaching the final. The less confident pupils/those who don't normally get a chance gained a lot of confidence and teamwork skills and this really helped 5 pupils in particular. Although some pupils were identified as talented and given the opportunity to attend Cramlington Rockets rugby club, they already have sporting commitments elsewhere.
Y5/6 Athletics x 40	✓4	Children showed increased confidence and demonstrated teamwork and strategy skills. Experience of taking part in competition for pupils who might not have been to other competitions. One of our teams won the competition and went on to represent our area at the Northumberland School Games.
Y6 Netball x 16	✓2	The girls loved this competition. They played really well as a team and performed well, putting into practice what they had learnt at extra-curricular netball club. They showed good teamwork and showed ongoing improvement as the competition progressed.
Northumberland School Games Level 3	✓Y5/6 Athletics, Y5 boys football, Y3/4 gymnastics	All of the teams had a great experience and their performances were celebrated in school, before and after the competitions. Our gymnastics team finished in third place. Children have been inspired to attend out of school clubs to try and get a place on the school team after seeing the success of these teams in the previous year.

EYFS Yoga (Debbie MacAlister)	✓	Reception - Children were very engaged and looked forward to the sessions. This engagement was particularly noticeable in the youngest children in the year group. The sessions were very calming and a nice way to start a morning, encouraging mindfulness.
Y5/6 Sports Leader Training with Tony Dowson	✓	Developed a sense of responsibility through the games organisation. Developed confidence and communication skills which have been used in all areas of school life.
Sports Leaders active in the playground (school-based programme)	✓	The sports leaders active at whole-school playtime gives the Y6 pupils a responsibility and has a big impact on the younger children as they enthusiastically join in the games and look up to the older leaders.
KS2 G&T Dance Academy (January and June intakes)	✓ 3	Three pupils attended the Dance Academy from 2015-16, after being invited to audition. Two pupils were invited to join. These two pupils were part of the Dance

		Academy performance at The Sage. This was a fantastic experience for the pupils, who were working with a group of pupils from schools across Cramlington. Parents of each of the children also attended, being very proud of their children and appreciating the experience it had given them.
Y5/6 G&T Multiskills Academy Testing	6	Confidence boost for these 6 pupils to be chosen to represent the school.
Y5/6 G&T Multiskills Academy selection	5	Great experience working with children from other schools – they formed good friendships over the course which will help their transition to CLV. The Academy was a good opportunity for these more able pupils to be challenged and to work alongside other more able children.
