## OTHER NEWS

As you may have heard from your children, we have been trialling a system of yellow and red cards in the Dining Hall and at playtimes and lunchtimes. This has been a means to visually reinforce our behaviour management policy and the children have responded to it very well, appreciating the link to football. We are in the process of reviewing the trial with the children and will be updating our Positive Behaviour Management policy to reflect any changes in the Autumn Term.

We are also looking at trialling a number of changes to the organisation of the Dining Hall with our older children taking greater responsibility for the pouring of water, collection of desserts and assisting with the scraping of plates. In the Dining Hall, our dinner nannies are primarily there to supervise all children and to support the younger children who are taking a school dinner. However recent weeks has seen a large amount of their time taken up assisting children with the unpacking of their packed lunches. Please would you ensure that, if your child brings a packed lunch, they are able to access all aspects of it themselves and that, if your child needs a spoon or other cutlery, it is provided for them in their packed lunch. Please note, water is always available for all children.

Our procedure across school is that when children are standing in line, they are silent. We appreciate that this is still a work in progress, and that this can sometimes be difficult for our younger children, however we do ask that you support us with this as it helps to maintain a quiet and calm atmosphere in school. At lunchtimes, we ask children also to cease talking when food is being served from the hatch. Once food has finished being served, then children may talk, however as some of our children find raised noise levels tricky, there are times when we need to stop the children talking in order to remind them to use quieter voices indoors.

We are also trialling named tables for lunches where children sit next to a friend on mixed-age tables. Again this is a work in progress which we will be regularly reviewing with the children.
