## Pupil Premium Strategy [including CLA and Forces Children]

Seaton Delaval First School receives additional funding (a 'Pupil Premium') of £68,640 [2018/ 2019] to support pupils.

Seaton Delaval First School receives additional funding (a 'Pupil Premium') of £69,960 [2019/ 2020] to support pupils.

For the financial year 2018-19 this group numbered 52 children [25.4%] at Seaton Delaval First School.

Barriers:

- High proportion of children begin Nursery with no, or very little, pre-school experiences.
- Prime areas plus reading, writing and maths show 'not typical' attainment on entry when children complete their baselines.
- A high proportion of PP children/ pupils are also boys and SEND.
- Attendance is slightly lower for PP pupils [PP = 96.27% vs non-PP 96.43%] but still well above national average for all others.

Desired outcomes:

1. Improve rapidly knowledge, understanding and skills in Prime and Specific areas throughout Nursery and into Reception.
2. Diminish further any achievement differences between boys and girls in English and Mathematics throughout school and in every year group.
3. Diminish further any difference between Pupil Premium pupils and their peers in Mathematics, writing and SEND PP.
4. Diminish further any small differences in attendance between groups of pupils within school.

To meet the School Development Plan objectives we used the additional funding for the following [2019 - 2020 inclusive]:

Full-time, highly qualified and experienced NNEB and Level 3 LSA in EYFS2 [Reception]

Experienced HLTA to work in EYFS 1 [Nursery]

NNEB in EYFS 2 to deliver "Talk Boost" and Early Interventions

Every class has a LSA for at least 4 mornings every week and most 5 mornings

LSA to do Speech and Language plus target support 2 afternoons every week

LSA's to work with target readers

O2O Maths in KS1 Y1 - 2 afternoons

O2O Maths in KS1 Y2 - 2 afternoons

LSA interventions - spelling groups, phonic groups, O2O reading, RWI, Nurture groups, Wave 3

Maths, Numricon Maths

Handwriting interventions

Basic Maths skills interventions

Extra English [3 x pm's] - Y1 and Y2 [teachers][Booster and Challenge]

Extra Maths [3 x pm's] - Y1 and Y2 [teachers] [Booster and Challenge]

ELSA in KS2

RWI - every morning for targeted pupils

JB [senior teacher] 2 days per week extra Maths and English in KS2 [Booster and Challenge]

SENDCO has 2 afternoon's weekly to support disadvantaged pupils and parents, chair TAF, liaise with agencies, sign-post courses/ groups, etc.

**Seaton Delaval First School has budgeted to spend £78, 378 on the above support.**

Nurture group in KS1

LSA to support vulnerable pupils at playtimes with social interaction

Completely fund intra-school events and workshops [travel and staffing]

All trips heavily subsidised by school

Visiting theatre and Music groups paid for by school

Year 4 - instrumental tuition for the whole class all year - no contribution requested

Hip Hop - no charge for use of hall to keep cost down
