School Safeguarding Review

As a staff, we have recently shared the 'Run, hide, tell' video that addresses the threat of terrorism to us as a society. Safeguarding is a key priority, and in response to our most recent training, we have created a school action plan. Mrs Bennett led an assembly for pupils from Years 1 to 4 and presented our new ideas in a way that was reassuring to the children from the point of view of keeping them safe in school all of the time. Teachers are also continuing these discussions so that the children have opportunities to ask further questions and address any concerns. Some of the actions will take effect immediately, whilst others will be rolled out across the next few months. We would like to share the content of these actions with you:

1. All classroom doors will be fitted with thumb locks. This will provide an extra level of security to allow teachers to lock classroom doors should we feel that we need to contain the classes to their area.
2. All staff are fully aware of the lockdown procedure. This would include locking the classroom door, closing the blind, switching lights off and assembling everyone on the classroom floor. Whilst we do not want to scare the children, it is felt that practising such procedures alongside fire practices, the children will be rehearsed and less likely to panic should we need to exercise the procedure.
3. If the children are playing outdoors and we want to bring them indoors due to a potential outdoor risk, the bell will ring five times. This will indicate that they must



calmly walk into school through the community room door and make their way to their registration classrooms.

4. Each classroom will have a red laminated spot positioned on the white board that has 'HELP' and the year group displayed on it. If they are worried about a teacher becoming poorly or a teacher needs immediate assistance, they will take the spot quickly to the nearest adult. The same system will be used with a green laminated spot with 'FIRST AID' written on for immediate assistance in the yard at breaktime.
5. Depending on budget, the library area could be re-located into classroom areas to support topic work. The original library would be made into a meeting room for staff, parents and also multi-agency meetings. This would ensure that such meetings would take place at the front of the school and visitors would not have to walk through the school where children are learning to areas that are currently used. This would also include a fobbed door in between the meeting room and the school hall. The purpose of this would be to create an additional holding area, again improving security to the main building.
6. Every classroom will have a telephone installed. This will incorporate a tannoy system for whole school announcements such as a rainy breaktime. It will also help Mrs Heslegrave to get a message to individual classrooms without leaving the office area which should be manned at all times. It will also provide teachers with the options of contacting the office or other classroom areas.

We hope that you agree that these ideas would enhance safeguarding and ensure that we have considered a range of current scenarios making sure that our whole school community is kept as safe as possible. Should you require any further clarification or feel that you have an idea that could be considered, please feel free to approach me to discuss further.

Tanzania Day


