Year 4 have been working really hard producing these BRILLIANT posters about evacuation during World War 2. The presentation of their work is fantastic and the information was so interesting to read.








Emily is Year 2 also produced this fantastic piece of work on hedgehogs!

## Sailing on The James Cook

What a brilliant day some of our Year 4 pupils had with Mrs Walsh and Mrs Bennett on Thursday. Eleven children were selected to participate in a team work challenge day, learning how to stay safe on-board, steer the boat and generally learn about life as crew on-board the James Cook. The trip was organised for us by **Ocean Youth Trust** following some funding that was made available for the children within Seaton Sluice and New Hartley. Well done everyone- it was a truly memorable, fun experience!

### Healthy Lifestyles Grant

Mrs Bennett applied for a grant in June 2018 for additional funding from Northumberland County Council linked to healthy lifestyles. The money was made available by the government following the sugar tax. We are delighted to say that we have been awarded the maximum amount of £10,000! This is fantastic news and the money will be used to develop our 'Enchanted Forest' area- creating a gardening area to grow our own produce (which we will cook with) and a sound trail consisting of large scale musical instruments for the children to run to and perform on. There will be a special celebration event which Mrs Bennett will attend along with Mrs Stirling and Mrs Blakely, two of our governors.
