Dear Parents/Carers,

As you're probably aware, the government's guidance on the coronavirus has changed from the 'contain' phase to one of delaying the spread of the virus. We're getting in touch to let you know what we're doing in light of this, and what we expect from all of you, to help make sure our school community keeps safe and calm.

We'd like to reassure you that at St Bede's Primary we're taking all of the necessary steps to protect our community and are continuing to follow official guidance from the government.

What's the current situation?

- The **school remains open** – this is the current official guidance we've been given
- School functions remain usual and we are trying to continue with after school clubs.
- Pupils should attend unless they feel unwell – if your child - or anyone in the household has any of the following symptoms they **should remain at home for 14 days**:
 - A new, continuous cough and/or
 - A high temperature
- Pupils should also **remain at home for 14 days** if anyone they live with has the above symptoms
- If your child is unwell or is self-isolating, report this as you would normally by contacting the school office on 01670 822389
- We'll keep you up to date with any changes to the current situation via email or on social media

What we're doing to protect and support pupils and staff

- After school clubs and other events that involve visitors coming into school have been postponed
- All children have access to soap and water to wash their hands regularly throughout the school day
- If staff or children become unwell on site with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature they will be sent home
- The school site and equipment are being cleaned and disinfected more regularly

What we need you to do

- If you've recently changed your contact details, please inform the school office **as soon as possible** via telephone or email: admin@st-bedes.northumberland.sch.uk
- Talk to your children about the coronavirus. It's a scary time and we should make sure children feel supported. [BBC Newsround](#) has regular updates for younger children and [YoungMinds](#) has practical steps older children can take to help with anxiety
- Come and collect your child straight away, if we ask you to (we'll contact you if they become ill with either a temperature or a new, continuous cough)

What happens if the school has to close?

We'll only close if we're either officially advised to do so or we don't have enough staff to run the school.

In either case, we'll:

- Alert parents via text, email, our school website and social media
- We will let parents know when school is reopened by text, email, our school website and social media
- We will email parents with information of how to support your child with learning at home.

Please keep in mind that we're only sending out this information to help the school community prepare. There are currently no plans to close.
