

## St Cuthbert's RC First School - Uniform Leaflet

**Please read carefully before purchasing uniform for September.**

### UNIFORM

- White polo shirt
- **GREY**; trousers / skirt / pinafore / shorts – *NO leggings / NO decoration / zips / leather*
- Red & white checked dress
- Red school jumper or cardigan **this should be WITH the school badge** - *NO hoodies*
- Black school shoes – laces *only* if your child can tie them otherwise velcro is best. Boots in winter only - *No trainers or canvas*



## **PE UNIFORM**

- Red t-shirt **this should be WITH the school badge**
- Red school hoodie **WITH the school badge**
- Black shorts – no football club emblem or other logo - *NO leggings*
- Black jogging bottoms - *NO football club emblem or other logo*
- Black plimsolls - *NO trainers*

## **HAIRSTYLES**

- Neat / tidy / formal / natural colour –*NO shaved / NO shapes or tram lines*
- Long hair **MUST** be tied up

## **JEWELLERY**

Students may wear a watch but no other jewellery is permitted.

### ***NO EARRINGS TO BE WORN***

If parents/carers and students wish to arrange piercing, this must be done at the start of the summer holidays so that the wound has sufficient time to heal.

***Please note: These are the same rules applied at Middle School***

The advantages of pupils conforming to such a code of appropriate school dress include:

- The encouragement of a purposeful attitude to work and positive behaviour
- The promotion of a positive school ethos and a sense of identification with, and loyalty to, the school
- A reduction in bullying and victimisation which can arise from peer pressure to adhere to certain fashion trends

  - The creation of a positive image in the local community
- Assisting parents/carers in terms of economic and practical issues
