

Swansfield Park First School – Primary PE Funding 2014/15

Under the Primary PE & Sport funding initiative, in 2014/15 we received £8583 to support PE and sport in our school. The way in which it was spent considered:

- Target 1: delivery of high quality PE lessons
- Target 2: participation and success in competitive school sport
- Target 3: a broader range of activities on offer
- Target 4: personal health and well-being of pupils
- Target 5: promoting pupil activity through involvement in organised games at breaks and lunchtime.
- Target 6: improved attitudes and behaviour towards learning

The money was spent in the following ways:

Employing a specialist PE teacher to deliver high quality lessons across all year groups; to establish inter and intra school competitions; to run lunchtime and after school sports clubs. £6000	Impact: Consistent and progressive whole-school PE programme supporting development across key areas (<i>Targets 1, 2, 3</i>). Participation levels in lunchtime and after school sports clubs high, across target groups – girls/PP (<i>Targets 2, 3, 4, 5</i>).
Employing a local coach/mentor to provide 32 weekly urban sports sessions for a targeted group of key stage 2 children. Each session was preceded with a group mentoring session to set individual targets £600	Impact: (<i>Targets 3, 4, 6</i>)
Urban Sport Holiday Club to encourage targeted children to participate in sporting activities during each of the school holidays - 5 places purchased per holiday £700	Impact: (<i>Targets 3, 4, 6</i>)
Specialist coaching for tennis for Y2/3 in the summer term, together with a Y3 tournament. Year round after school tennis club £500	Impact: all Willow class participated in weekly tennis sessions during the summer term; Y3 children chosen to represent the school in the Tony Blair interschool tennis tournament. Extra-curricula tennis coaching provided throughout the year, including signposting to local coach providing gateway into tennis locally. CPD for KS2 NQT, supporting greater understanding of delivery of racquet sports during PE lessons. (<i>Targets 1, 2, 3, 4</i>)
Specialist coaching for gymnastics in KS2 in the spring term. £200	Impact: Children participated in weekly gymnastics sessions, including signposting to local coach providing gateway into gymnastics locally. CPD for KS2 NQT, supporting greater confidence in delivery of gymnastics during PE lessons. (<i>Targets 1, 3, 4</i>)
Transport for inter-school tournaments. £200	Impact: Children able to attend inter-

	school tournaments without having to provide contributions to cover associated costs, allowing for inclusivity of opportunity. <i>(Targets 2, 3)</i>
