Year 2 and Year 6 SATs

We are extremely proud of our hard working Year 2 children at both schools and our Year 6 children at Whalton. Staff across the Federation ensured that the children felt comfortable and under no undue pressure and were always reassured that they just needed to do their very best. Team Whalton were amazing at helping the Year 6 children prepare for their SATs too - breakfast clubs in the run up to and delicious snacks between SATs papers; there was even a report that the children were excited for the SATs which is the best compliment any child can give us! In fact the only stressful part was trying to put the right papers in the right envelopes with the correct labels and registers following the tests for the courier - and that was for us staff! How your children have achieved in the statutory tests will be sent out with your child's report on Friday 12th July.

Attendance

Just prior to the holidays we reviewed our Federation Attendance policy which will be going to Governors for formal approval this half term. Huge thanks to Mrs Bates and Mr Hague for their input and comments. We have attached our reviewed parent/carer leaflet, which although still in draft form will hopefully give you an overview of the legal expectations, our systems and also helpful hints to decision making when planning holidays and booking essential appointments so that we can work together to minimise any disruptions to your children's learning; a day before or after a half term makes a great difference to the price of a holiday but also decreases the amount of time away from school as once that sequence of learning has been taught (or missed), the teacher moves on to new objectives which makes building upon any prior knowledge for any children who have missed the previous teaching very difficult, especially if a child has missed a week or two weeks of the curriculum.

The tables below show what our current position is in terms of statistics for attendance. Although we are at the national average at Longhorsley and above for attendance at Whalton, our unauthorised absence at Longhorsley is above national for the Spring term 1.28% v 1.2% (this does not include illness).


