Weekly Events:

Times Tables: The children will have speed tests on their times tables on most days but extra practice at home will ensure the facts are embedded. By the end of Year 4, the children need to be able to recall the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 & 10x tables' facts, at speed.

Homework: Each **Thursday** your child will receive a homework task to be completed and handed in by the following **Wednesday**. If he/she struggles with the work given or finds it not challenging enough, please let me know.



Art and Design Technology:

We will look carefully at mosaics and Roman Art before having recreating our own.
In Technology, we will design, make and evaluate Roman catapults. We shall also have to put them safely to the test

Computing:

This term we will spend time creating documents and mixed media presentations, thinking about where to store them so that they can be easily retrieved.

History:
