Topic: My Local Area

There are so many exciting things to discover about our local area. Our aim this term is to find out more about the history and geography of Whalton and the surrounding area, including understanding who was Emily Davison? What are the important changes that have happened in our locality and how do we know about them? Where is the evidence?



PE: In the first half of the term we will be leaning how to play rugby. During the second half term, we will be creating and performing dance routines in readiness for our Christmas Play.

PE KIT: *As PE may happen on more than one day in the week, we ask that the children bring in their kit, as soon as possible, for storing on their pegs; they will change for PE at school.*

French: we shall explore the language through songs and rhymes.

Art and Design:

The Pitmen Painters produced artwork based on the everyday lives of the miners. We shall examine their work, saying what we like and dislike about it. After taking photographs of local buildings, we shall reproduce them in different media. In Design Technology we will look at pulleys and winches.

Weekly Events:

Spellings: Every Thursday there will be a spelling test, beginning Thursday 5th September 2019.

Reading Challenge: Children are asked to read at home at least 3 times a week to achieve the weekly reading challenge. For us to be sure that they have achieved the challenge, we ask that parents record their child's reading with any comments in the reading diary. Reading Challenge will be recorded on Fridays.

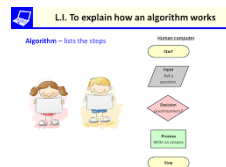
Times Tables: The children will have '1 minute' speed tests on their times tables on most days but extra practice at home will ensure the facts are embedded. By the end of Year 3, the children need to be able to recall the 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12x tables' facts, with speed.

Homework: Each Thursday your child will receive a homework task to be completed and handed in by the following Wednesday. If he/she struggles with the work given or finds it not challenging enough, please let me know.



PHSE: We will look at how rules are important to communities. We shall look at what we are good at and what we need to do to improve.

History: How did the Border Reivers affect our local area? What can we find out about the important events that have shaped Whalton and beyond? Coal Mining has been a very important industry in the North East – what was it like?

RE: Creation is the first book in Big Story of the Bible; what does it tell Christians about God and the world? We will also look at the Christian festivals of Harvest, Remembrance and Christmas.

Computing: We will investigate simple algorithms and block coding and try to understand how to debug mistakes.

Science: Animals, including humans, will be the focus this term. We shall look at the reasons human and animals have skeletons and muscles. We shall also look at the importance of getting the right nutrition for healthy development.

Geography: Can we locate some counties and cities of the UK confidently? How accurate will our maps/plans of Whalton be, when compared to the official ones?
