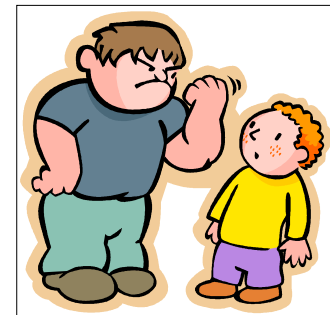


Stocksfield Avenue Primary School
School Council – Anti-Bullying Policy Statement



Rationale:

- We are a happy, caring school who do our best to look after each other. We hope there is no bullying at our school, but if you feel that you are here is some guidance for you.

What is bullying?

We took a whole school survey on what the children in our school think bullying is. Here is what they said:

- Bullying is something that is neither a one-off incident nor an accident. It is something that is deliberate and happens repeatedly over a period of time.
- Bullying can be physical, verbal, emotional or cyber.

If you feel unhappy at school because of someone else, please tell your teacher or an adult straight away.

What we will do about bullying:

- Mrs Hayes will speak with the person who has been bullied and keep a record.
- Mrs Hayes will speak with the person/people involved.
- Parents will be contacted.
- A contract will be signed by child/school.



Conclusion:

We **will** treat all complaints about bullying seriously. It is important if you think you are being bullied, you **must** tell a member of staff, or your family **straight away!**
