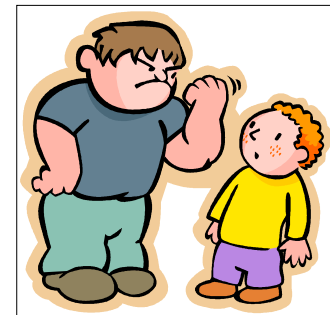


Stocksfield Avenue Primary School  
School Council – Anti-Bullying Policy Statement



**Rationale:**

- We are a happy, caring and inclusive school that does our best to look after each other. We hope there is no bullying at our school, but if you feel that you are here is some guidance for you.

**What is bullying?**

We took a whole school survey on what the children in our school think bullying is. Here is what they said:

- Bullying is something that is neither a one-off incident nor an accident. It is something that is deliberate and happens repeatedly over a period of time.
- Bullying can be physical, verbal, emotional or cyber.
- Pupils with SEN or disabilities are often at greater risk of being bullied than other pupils on the basis of their educational difficulties or disabilities.

**If you feel unhappy at school because of someone else, please tell your teacher or an adult straight away.**

**What we will do about bullying:**

- The School Leaders will speak with the person who has been bullied and keep a record.
- The School Leaders will speak with the person/people involved.
- Parents will be contacted.
- Further action may need to be taken by the school.



**Conclusion:**

We **will** treat all complaints about bullying seriously. It is important if you think you are being bullied, you **must** tell a member of staff, or your family **straight away!**
