Our new Reception children have been amazing. Leaving parents at the school gates is unheard of in modern times, and yet this is what they have had to do. We're delighted that all children have joined us full-time and we know that we are one of very few schools who have offered this option this year, most insisting on a longer, part-time offer.

With rules changing all the time, and the number of cases on the rise, it is important we keep doing our part with these new routines. Thank you!
