Governor Observations and Comments			
<p>The purpose of this visit was for the children to gain greater insight into their current topic of WW11. At Flambards in Helston where there is an excellent set of a Blitz site. The children spent all morning learning about the Blitz and were divided into groups with the year 6 children taking the lead on the activities of the younger KS2 children. They were briefed by the teaching staff and the led their groups through the Blitz area and completed the worksheets that they had been issued with. The children knew exactly what they were expected to do and the year 6 children demonstrated excellent leadership and guidance skills. The younger children followed the instruction well and the morning was a huge success with the children gaining a realistic experience as to what it might have been like to have lived through the Blitz.</p> <p>The children then had lunch in the designated area and were closely supervised by the large number of teachers, teaching assistants and parent helpers that were on the trip.</p> <p>Following lunch the children were allowed in groups to go on the fairground rides at Flambards.</p>
