Road Safety Week 2017

This week in school we are again taking part in **UK Road Safety Week**, coordinated by Brake, the road safety charity. The children will be learning about road safety and the importance of drivers keeping their *Speed Down to Save Lives*. In the UK speeding is still a major problem. It causes needless crashes, untold suffering and stops people living safe and healthy lives. Simply put, it is a driver's speed that will determine whether they can stop in time and, if they can't stop, how hard they will hit. **Research has shown that children under the age of 15 can't judge the speed of approaching vehicles travelling at over 20mph. They may think it's safe to cross when it's not.**

At school: We will discuss road safety with the children, in assembly time and in class. We will talk about using roads safely by following the Green Cross Code; about the dangers of fast traffic; and about how walking and cycling is good for our health and the environment.

At home: Please help us make local roads safer by reinforcing the same clear messages at home. In particular, we ask you to:

- cross roads safely with your child and teach them the Green Cross Code.
- make sure your children hold an adult's hand around roads until they are at least eight.
- help your child learn about safe walking/cycling routes in the area, especially any traffic-free paths or quiet roads with slow traffic and good pavements.
- if you drive, protect children (and adults) by slowing down and going 20mph or below around homes, schools and shops.

Thunder In The Valley

We saw an absolutely amazing effort by our Key Stage 2 pupils on Friday night at Sport Central, Newcastle, as they competed in the Thunder In The Valley basketball competition. Teams competed in three mini leagues, with the winners of each and the best runner up playing in the semi-finals. This all took place before the Newcastle Eagle game, with the Thunder In The Valley final taking place at half time. As the defending champions, the pressure was on us, but our children competed superbly. Whytrig1 played 5, winning 4 and lost 1 to qualify as the highest placed runner up; Whytrig 2 played 5, winning 4 and drawing 1 to qualify as the winner of their group. Unfortunately, they were drawn against each other in the semi-final, with Whytrig 1 winning on a penalty shot after the score was tied 0-0 at the end of full time. A great conclusion to a superb evening of basketball, with our children showing that they were great ambassadors for our school, even without such a fantastic result!

He taught us about pounds, shillings and pence; told us about rationing; prepared us with a gas mask drill and even produced his own Identity Card. Genuine living history! Before we came home, we had time to follow 'Lizzie Dowson's Trail' around Ouseburn, finding clues from the past in the buildings and along the river. (Who knew there was a footpath made from gravestones by the old Ouseburn School?) We even explored St Ann's churchyard and made several interesting discoveries, not least that a man named Thomas Beanland Henzell is buried there! A jam-packed, fun-filled day of learning that has left us with lots of great memories!

- Be able to reply by email or text.
- Send us any reasons for absence via app, text or email.
- Top-up your son/daughter's lunch account quickly and easily, as well as monitor their spending.
