## Parents evenings

### **Welcome to Miss Mills**

Our school is part of the Whitley Bay High School Teaching Alliance along with Spring Gardens Primary, King Edward Primary and South Wellfield First School. We host and train School Direct students as a school based route into teaching. Mr Russell was a School Direct student with us last year and we then appointed him as a class teacher at the end of his training.



Miss Henderson is our host student this year; she worked in Year 3 in Autumn term but is now carrying out a placement at another school, and we in turn offer a placement to the host student from King Edwards Primary, Miss Mills.

Miss Mills will be carrying out her placement for the 4 weeks after half term and is currently in school working alongside the Year 1 team in preparation for her placement. ### **Competition for world changing ideas**

Last week we had an assembly that helped launch a regional competition that will see primary age children come up with ideas which could change the world for the better. Sam Galilee from North Tyneside Learning Trust gave an inspirational presentation on how the children could use their imaginations and creativity to make a difference.

#TyneTogether2018 is being run by North Tyneside Learning Trust, the schools group which our school is a part of, and *7billionideas*. It is open to Key Stage 1 and 2 pupils across the region from North Tyneside Learning Trust schools and this is the second year that the competition has run. The children will work in small groups to

come up with 'world-changing' ideas to make a positive difference in their local and global communities, in the hope of being shortlisted for the competition final in March. The winning idea will be turned into a children's book that will go live onto Amazon.

After half term, we will run an after school club run by Mr Young on Fridays, at which the children will complete their projects for the competition. Please watch out for information about the club if your child is interested in participating in this project.

We are delighted to let you know that an application made by our Early Years staff team to the Tesco Bags of Help Grant Scheme, has been successful and our project is being put forward to a customer vote in Tesco stores during March and April 2018.
