## Ofsted report

Thank you for the comments about our recent Ofsted report. I would like to clarify something that I was asked this week by a parent, regarding the report. The difference in this new Ofsted framework under which we were inspected, is that Achievement is a limiting judgement. This means that if Ofsted grades Achievement a 2 (Good), then all of the other categories can be no higher than a 2. This is a restriction of the new framework.

Our school satisfied a significant number of the 'Outstanding' criteria in each of the categories, but whilst the achievement of Reading and Writing is '*outstanding*', achievement in Maths is '*good*' (and is our key focus this year, as I explained to parents in

September) so we were not able to be given a 1 (outstanding) for achievement overall. This in turn meant that every other category had to be a 2 - even when we satisfy a great deal of the outstanding criteria for Behaviour and Safety, Early Years, Teaching and Learning and Leadership and Management. Under a previous framework our school would have been said to be 'good with outstanding features' as other schools have been told. But this cannot be the case now under the new framework.

Although we are happy with the positives in the report, there are some frustrations particularly with the fact that our children, whose behaviour we know is outstanding, couldn't even be awarded outstanding due to the limitations of this framework. I have written to Michael Wilshaw at Ofsted, but have had no response as yet.

We are proud of our children, we are always working hard to further improve our school, on our journey towards becoming an outstanding school. We would like to say thank you very much to the Governors, staff, parents and children for all of the support and hard work along the way.
