Reading

- Please read every day and try to share a book with your family.
- Keep practising Rainbow words
- Try to save any interesting words to use in your writing

Life Skills

- Learn to get changed into your PE kit in under 5 minutes
- Make sure you can write your full name and include a capital letter for each initial letter

P.E. and Health

- Try to be active for at least 60 mins per day.
- How good is your hopping? Can you hop on your left foot? On your right? What is the most hops you can do?
- What do you notice about your breathing/ heart beat after exercise?

Writing

- Write about the reptile you made in science. Try to use a title and subtitles in your writing to organise it. E.g. where does it come from? What does it look like? What does it eat?

Geography

- Last week you drew a map of your bedroom. Most maps include symbols and a key to tell you what each symbol means. Draw your own treasure map and include a key to show what each symbol means.

Science

- Choose a reptile and build a model or draw a picture of it. Can you show the habitat it lives in?

Spelling and Punctuation and Grammar

- Continue to work through Rainbow words so that you can read and spell them all
- Look at the suffixes **er** and **est**. Using twigs, leaves, playdough etc make and label some monsters(e.g. Tall, taller, tallest - short, shorter, shortest etc.)

History

- Draw a timeline of your life so far. Include any important dates e.g. the day you started school, a very memorable holiday etc, You can illustrate your timeline to make it interesting to look at.

Maths

- Draw o'clock times and half past times. Be sure to draw the long hand and the short hand carefully. Think where your short hand will be at a half past time.
- Starting from an o'clock or half past time, what time will it be an hour later/half an hour later? An hour earlier/half an hour earlier?

Reading

Design a quiz for your favorite book. After reading the book can you make up questions for a family member to answer about the story. Can you include some easy and some more difficult questions for your family members to answer? Perhaps you could include some helpful hints. Remember to keep reading every day and sharing stories with your family.

Life Skills

Can you write a set of instructions for how to get dressed in the morning?
Can you go outside in your garden and observe and draw the different plants?

P.E. and Health

In P.E we have been thinking of ways of passing the ball such as kicking, rolling and chest pass. Can you invent your own ball game with your family. Think about ways you could pass the ball, how many players you will need and how you will score points or win the game?

Writing

In Literacy we are learning about information texts. Can you choose an animal to research and write an information text about this animal. You might want to include information like; what it looks like, what it eats, how it moves, where it lives and any other interesting facts.

Geography

Can you name the points North, South, East and West on a compass?
Blindfold a grown up or sibling. Can you guide them to some hidden treasure using the directions North, South, East and West.
Design a pirate map and divide it into squares. Can you include some key objects like palm tree, treasure chest, skull and cross bones. Guide the Pirate around the map using the words North, South, East and West.

Science

Watch videos on <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zx882hv> to find out more about habitats. Write the headings: polar, ocean, woodland, rainforest, urban, desert and pond habitats. Can you write a list of animals that you think could be found in each habitat?

Spelling and Punctuation and Grammar

History

Can you research about George Stephenson? Where did he live? What did he do?
What was the name of his locomotive? Can you design and label a train that might win in a race today?

Can you give directions to a member of your family to move around your house? Can you include quarter, half and three quarter turns?

Reading

Life Skills

P.E. and Health

Ensure you get at least 60 minutes of exercise each day.

Stay active by completing online fitness workouts such as PE with Joe Wicks and Cosmic Kids Yoga.

Writing

Write an adventure story, imagining what you would rather be doing during this time. Think about the things you are looking forward to and what you miss about being outdoors.

Remember to make your writing interesting and include different characters and settings. Let your imagination run wild!

History

Begin researching Tutankhamun. What was his role in Ancient Egypt? How old was he when he died? Who discovered him? Find out as many facts about him as you can.

Science

Make your own shadow puppet theatre. How does the distance between the light source and the puppets affect the performance?

Spelling and Punctuation and Grammar

Check that the writing you have done so far contains the correct punctuation; capital letters, full stops, commas, question marks.

Art

Can you create your own drawing of what you can see out of your window? Make it as detailed as possible and use a pencil to sketch it before colouring it in.

Maths

Keep practising Times Table Rock Stars for at least 15 mins per day. Make sure you go in the studio at least once a week.

Handwriting phrases for helping your child to form letters

This works best if your child practises for a short time every day.

1. Show the picture side and air-write as you say the phrase.
2. Ask your child to practise in the air with you.
3. Using a sharp pencil and sat at a table, encourage your child to have a go.
